### BY GEORGE....

Back in my Grandville days at this time of the year we would have been doing our annual stewardship renewal. Dave, the stewardship director for the parish, would have invited his fellow parishioners to "take a step". He would have challenged them that if the were presently praying for five minutes a day could they then "take a step" and make it six minutes, or seven, or ten, to grow in their relationship with God. If they were volunteering one hour a week could they then "take a step" and help for an hour and a quarter or an hour an a half a week. If they were contributing one percent of their income to the church and the works of charity could they then "take a step" and make it a percent and a half, or two percent, or the full tithe of ten percent. The point of Dave's invitation each year was that in our spiritual lives as in all aspects of our lives the goal is to grow - to go forward, not to go backward. Hence, he had the image of "taking a step" to keep encouraging the other parishioners to continue to move forward in a direction toward, not away from, God and God's Kingdom.

As we come to this time of the year we are coming to the end of the liturgical year with the arrival of the Feast of Christ the King next Sunday. Our Gospel reading for this Sunday and next Sunday and the following Sunday being the first Sunday of Advent all are going to direct us to focus on the end - the end of times, the end of our lives here on earth, the end of earthly life in general. The focus of those Gospel readings will be to keep us moving forward, forward toward God not just spiritually but literally. Notice that our focus here in Church will be somewhat different than the focus of our secular society at this time of the year with Black Friday and Christmas advertisements trying to convince us that the good deals we can get shopping will provide us with that stuff which will make our lives more meaningful -- until, of course, we get the credit card bills for what we splurged to buy and then realize that more important to us than the stuff that we didn't really need is the interior peace of living a life centered on the Kingdom of God, not on the material things that do not reflect God to us.

Simply look out the windows at the trees. At this time during the year what are the trees telling us as they lose their leaves? What do the cold winds from the north tell us and the snow that will soon blanket everything? The end is coming to us all at some time probably unknown to us. When that end comes the question for us is where we would like to be found at that time of the end. If Dave were here I am sure that he would remind us to be sure to take the step in the right direction not the wrong one.
