Thank you once again for those of you remembering to mail in your contributions or your CSA pledge cards. As you can see, collections are down.

Two weeks ago I wrote about the discipline of our wills in the context of our adventure with the coronavirus. During Lent each year we are supposed to be practicing the discipline of our wills -- meaning teaching ourselves to choose that which we know to be good for ourselves and others, not that which we know to be harmful to others and ourselves. The coronavirus is forcing us all to confront ourselves and our willfulness given that we can no longer go where we want to go or do what we want to do. Therefore our choice seems to be that either we seriously get busy disciplining our wills or the coronavirus will do it for us.

Last week I wrote about patience. For how many of us is this adventure with the coronavirus a matter that is testing our patience? As this goes on longer, and longer, and longer, and when we are in the third or fourth month of guarantine and not being able to do what we want to do, our patience will get stretched more and more thinly. We will become more and more upset because we can't do what we want to do when we want to do it. Then we will take out our impatience on those around us. The ones that we are supposed to love the best are the ones that we will start treating the worst. We will become impatient as we come to realize that we are not God and that things are not going to go the way that we want them to go. Remember though that not even for God do things go the way God would want them to go. If they did there would have been no such thing that we call "sin" that was created by Adam and Eve. Once God gave to us the gift of "free will" any control God had over us was gone. The coronavirus will teach us that any notion that we have control over mother nature, or other people or even ourselves is as deluded as our thinking that God has control over us to whom God has given the freedom to choose God or reject God in our lives.

Hence we come to Holy Week. Our focus of attention this week always turns to the one event in our lives that we most often have absolutely no control over, and that one event is death. As I watch on tv the daily count of infected people and the updated numbers of those who have died I am transported back to my childhood when on the tv news each night we watched the body counts of those killed in Vietnam. Going to a war zone we might have some reasonable expectation of being killed, but going to the grocery store in the past has not been in our consideration as a possibly fatal activity. Consider the activity for which Jesus was killed -- preaching about God. The fact that there have been some people in certain parts of our world who even in our time have suffered the same fate as Jesus for the same offense has been something that we have just dismissed from our minds as long as in our society we could go to the grocery store in peace. Now for us, as we turn on the news every night, death has become a new reality in our lives in a way we have ignored in the past. Perhaps this will be our best Holy Week ever for as we have come to a new understanding of the reality of death then perhaps there is hope that we can come to a new understanding of what it means to say to the women at the tomb, "Do not be afraid . . . he is not here, for he has been raised just as he said."


