With the arrival of Lent it is now time for our annual Catholic Services Appeal. Hopefully you remember that the CSA is the annual collection to provide Bishop Walkowiak with the funds needed for the operation of programs in the Diocese. Some of these programs include the televised Mass each Sunday for shut-ins or covid-19 avoiders, part of the cost of the seminary program for the formation of future priests, the work of the offices of Catholic Charities, the support of the Prison Ministry program to evangelize those who have been incarcerated, and the offices that support our Catholic schools and religious education programs.

The way in which the formula works by which the assessments for the parishes are determined simply divides the parish income into the total Diocesan income to get a percentage. For instance, this past year Blessed Sacrament Parish's income of \$710,314 was 1.633% of the total income of all of the parishes in the Diocese which was \$43,492,455 (down 3.5% from the prior year). The total Diocesan CSA assessment this year is \$5,800,000 (down 4.2% from the prior year). Multiply that amount by our percentage of diocesan income and we discover that our parish assessment this vear is \$94,725.

This assessment is a decrease of 3.73% from last year's tax of \$98,399 because the CSA is an income tax and our parish income has sadly decreased, so our CSA assessment has decreased. For the past year's appeal (2020), as of the end of January, we had pledges in the amount of \$106,161.64. We have collected \$99,189.64. The amount still outstanding is \$6,972. As you will notice we have not yet collected all that was pledged but only 93.4% of pledges. There are still two months of payments to be received as the annual 2020 campaign ends with March's payments. This past year we had 293 pledges or donations, down from 371 the previous year.

This week you should be receiving the mailing from the Bishop concerning this year's Catholic Services Appeal (they were supposed to be mailed this past Friday). Included should be a pledge card for you to complete and return to us here at the Parish Office (or drop it in the collection basket at Mass). Once again I thank you for your past support and ask you to be as generous this year as you can be given your family situation. It is my hope that everyone could give something (remember the widow's mite?) and that everyone will return their pledge cards promptly once you receive them. If you choose not to donate or pledge anything please simply fill out your card with \$0 and return it to us. If you wish to make a credit card donation you will need to do so on line at the Diocesan web site www.grdiocese.org/csa. Again thank you for your past support, and your continued support of the work of the Diocesan Church this year. If you have any questions about the CSA, as always, just let me know or contact Ken and Mary Lou West who coordinate the CSA for us each year.

ON-LINE GIVING IS NOW AVAILABLE

The "Donate Now" link on our website will take you to a secure website hosted by Parish Soft where you can make contributions (one-time or repeating) to the Sunday collection or to any of our funds such as Deacon George, Scholarship, Education Endowment, Building, or Christian Service. You can also select a memorial donation for a deceased parishioner, and there will be options for Diocesan Collections and Holy days at those times. You will be able to use a credit card or do an ACH transfer by entering your banking information.

We chose Parish Soft because we currently use the accounting and Parish Census modules offered by them and their Giving software is secure and integrates easily with the other modules. Additionally they offered us a year's trial with no monthly fees----only transaction fees of 2.6% for credit cards and .75% for ACH transactions.

Additionally this software can be used to sign up and pay for religious education classes, Vacation Bible School, etc. by providing a one-stop online option. Please contact Lori or Darrell in the parish office with any questions or feedback as we roll this out.

YOUTH CONTRIBUTION ENVELOPES

With the announcement at the last weekend's Masses of the new contribution envelopes for younger parishioners being available in the Church narthex questions were asked as to why there were no envelopes for a couple of the high school students who are in their senior year. The answer is that they have attained the age of 18 and once someone reaches that age they no longer are issued children's envelopes but adult envelopes if they follow the invitation on the front of the bulletin to register in their own names as adult members of the parish. Sadly some avoid doing so such that they don't get envelopes as they claim to be poor instead of admitting they are selfish. Just have them fill out a registration form from the parish web site and they will get their own adult envelopes.


