

Next Sunday is Christmas. It only happens once in every five or six years that Christmas falls on a Sunday. When I was a young priest I remember one of the older priests saying that Christmas Day falling on a Sunday is every pastor's nightmare and every associate pastor's dream. The reason he said this is that the pastor and not the associate pastor worries about the amount of the Sunday collections and if Christmas falls on a Sunday then the fear is that the collection will be smaller as there will be one collection for both Sunday and Christmas, whereas the associate pastor would be the one that would get to preside at most of the Masses especially when Christmas falls on a Saturday or Monday and we have Masses back to back to back on the three days, so he is happy not to have the successive days of Masses and having to write up multiple homilies. I have never worried about either.

This year with Christmas falling on a Sunday the guestion is whether we would follow the weekend schedule for Mass times or the holiday schedule for Mass times. After discussion the decision for this year is to try something a little different from each. Last year we had scheduled two Masses on Christmas Eve -- one at 4:30 p.m and one at 7:00 p.m., and one Mass on Christmas Day at 10:00 a.m. The schedule for Christmas is always a guestimate of when people will come. Unlike on Sundays, on Christmas the Vigil Mass at 4:30 p.m. is the Mass to which the greatest number of people come. Whatever time we have scheduled a second Mass on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Day those Masses have far fewer participants. The numbers for last year were at the 4:30 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass we had 425 participants; at the 7:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass we had less than 100 participants, and on Christmas at the 10:00 a.m. Mass we had 104 participants. Remember that the church building has seats for 600-650 people. If we combine the two Christmas Eve Masses from last year we would have a total of 525 people which means there would still be room for an additional 100-125 people. So what we have decided this year, given the numbers from last year, is that this year we will have just one Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve at 4:30 p.m. and one Mass on Christmas Day at 10:00 a.m. If you are one of those folks who have been talking about combining the Masses on Sundays so that the church would be "fuller" then you might wish to come to Christmas Eve Mass. If you are one who likes smaller crowds such that there is less noise, commotion, and distractions during Mass then you may wish to come to the Christmas Day Mass. For next year we will learn what the numbers tell us this year.




