Two weeks ago I had my six month dental appointment. I didn't go to see the dentist because I had a tooth ache, or a cavity, or had a tooth fall out, or anything negative like those events. I went to see the dentist as I do every six months for a preventive check up. The hygienist "cleans" my teeth and then polishes them with this great tasting chocolate paste of some kind. This time I was due to have x-rays taken which she did first. Then when she is done scraping on my teeth and having polished them with the chocolate paste the dentist comes in to take a look at my teeth and my tongue and mouth to make sure I don't have any cavities in the teeth or growths on the tongue or in my mouth that might be harmful to me. Then when I get my clean bill of dental health he tells me I am good for another six months. Then I drive back to the

How many of us do the same thing when we go to the dentist or to other doctors such as our primary care doctor or a specialist of some kind. The last time I saw the cardiologist he told me that he didn't need to see me in six months as we had been doing but that I didn't need to come back and see him for a year. The last time I saw my primary care doctor he told me I didn't have to come back for a year for my next physical since that is why I was there that day but he did tell me I needed to go to see one of the specialists because of a problem he had discovered. So then I saw the specialist who did his wonderful tests on me.

My point is that how many of us go to the dentist or to a doctor of some kind not because we have a problem but rather as a preventive check up such that if we have a problem of which we are not aware the doctor can catch it for us and we can treat it early instead of too late? Just like our dental health and our other physical health needs our active involvement and effort if we want to be healthy, so too the same can be said for our spiritual health. Just like some folks can get so involved in other activities that they neglect their physical health and neglect it so long that the heart attack or diagnosis of cancer is what it finally takes to get their attention, so the same can be true of ourselves with regard to our spiritual health. Do we need to wait for mortal sin to wake us up from our vanity? That suggests that the time to make the time to give ourselves a good spiritual examination is now because whenever now is it is a good time for a spiritual examination, as well as Lent is a good time, as well as now is summer and summer is a good time as for many people things slow down in the summer. School is not in session for children. Often families take a vacation away from work or other activities. The days seem to be longer when in reality we just have more hours of sunlight but therefore more hours to be awake than in the dreary darkness of December. Now is always the best of times for a spiritual examination, but now especially since now are the dog days of summer when we live in the light instead of in the darkness.




