## By George....

As I look out the window as I write this I am watching the snowflakes fall. We might ask how we can have snow already but today as I write this it is October 31, which means tomorrow is November and November snow is not an exception here where we live. This weekend we change our clocks moving them back an hour which means it will be a little lighter in the morning as the children come to school but it will be darker earlier in the evening. It won't be as extreme here as I remember it being 40 years ago when I was in the seminary in Belgium. If we moved that location to this continent we would find ourselves in the middle of Hudson's Bay as Belgium is that much farther north than is Michigan. I remember it getting dark an hour earlier in the winter and light an hour earlier in the summer than it does here. It was not unusual for us to be walking home to the seminary after our afternoon class at 4:30 and find the street lights on as we were walking in darkness. Also I remember in the summer being in the backyard of the seminary and playing volleyball at 11:00 p.m. without any lights on as it was still light enough for us to see. It is at this time of the year though that we get to spend more of our time in darkness.

Darkness is an important concept when we come to reflect upon our spirituality as followers of Christ. In John's theology of his Gospel and letters we know that Jesus is the "light of the world". For him "darkness" is a symbol of ignorance and sin. When we finally come to understand a difficult concept that someone is explaining to us we say that we have become "enlightened" or in the cartoons a light bulb would come on above our heads. Light is synonymous with understanding and dark is synonymous with not understanding or not knowing or ignorance. An easy example for those of us who are advanced in age is simply our experience that it becomes more difficult to drive after dark as our eyesight starts to fade with age. In darkness our abilities are limited and it is harder to see what is ahead of us as we drive. With our natural theology of living in Michigan this time of year heading into Christmas is a time that we can reflect on our encountering darkness -- not just the physical darkness we encounter with our spending less time in the sun but also the spiritual darkness we encounter with our spending less time in the Son as we reject his message and we give ourselves over to sin. This is a time of the year when a reading of the three short letters of John at the end of the New Testament can benefit us as John reminds us that "God is love and there is no darkness in him".






## ALL SAINTS DAY


