On Reception of Holy Communion

As our young ones receive their First Communion this weekend, it affords a great opportunity to review our own reception of Holy Communion. First of all congratulations to our First Communicants. What a joy to receive the Lord Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist.

Before I review reception of the Eucharist, let me say that I see very few issues with folks at our own parishes. If this is a simple review and you get it already, great! If not, it's not unusual to need to be more well-formed or reformed. In fact, this is a reality of our entire lives. I encourage you to share this with others because it might be helpful to them as well.

When it comes to receiving the Eucharist, if you are receiving on the hands, please make an altar. One hand crossing over the top of the other (firmly). Take the host from the hand it is placed on and consume it as immediately as possible. It is imperative that the Eucharist be received in front of the priest or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion.

Why? It assures us the host is not leaving the Church. We want to prevent the potential desecration of the Eucharist. Now, after you receive, please check your hand for any particles from the host and consume the particles. Every morsel of the host is Jesus, so we do not want to take this lightly. We don't need to be scrupulous either. A basic effort of inspection is fine.

Also, please do not swipe, take, or grab the Eucharist. Communion is meant to be received, not taken.

Now, in this diocese you have the option to receive on the hands or tongue as well as in various postures. Though the norm is standing, you are allowed to kneel. Either way, you should do a slight bow of the head while the person before you is receiving, if possible, to show reverence.

Regardless of posture or receiving on the tongue or the hands, reverence is the key. Are you being respectful are conscious of what you are receiving? It's not about being seen, it's about seeing Jesus in the Eucharist.

For those receiving on the tongue, please stick your tongue out. Do not bite. I think the best advice is to place your tongue out on your bottom lip...and please hold it there. Do not move your tongue until the Eucharist is placed upon it. Then simply retract your tongue.

Secondly, when receiving on the tongue, remain stationary. Please don't move around or try to follow the host. You also do not need to lower yourself down. Priests (even the shortest ones) can reach up.

Again, a very high majority are receiving correctly...nearly everyone. This is not the case at all places. So I am very grateful for the very consistent reverent reception at both parishes (and at school Masses).


