Faith is a Relationship

The vision I have set forth for the parishes is to "offer every person transformational encounters with Jesus." This past Sunday, the homily was a reminder that our encounter with Jesus is meant to have a personal dimension. While we as Catholics are often good with the communal dimensions of faith, we cannot neglect our personal, lived relationship with our Lord Jesus.

An interchangeable term with "transformational" is "life-changing." Both words are useful to discern how I have encountered Jesus in a personal way. I believe there is an initial encounter we have with Jesus that alters our life forever. It's sort of like the first disciples meeting Jesus on the seashore or like St. Paul being knocked to the ground and hearing the Lord ask why he is persecuting him. Subsequently, we have many other encounters that transform us and lead us deeper into our relationship with God.

The challenging part is we do not talk about this very much. And, if this is not part of your own faith experience, then faith becomes cold and usually results in a more transactional relationship with God. But God is not a vending machine. And our faith does not teach us that we earn God's favor, nor our salvation by being nice and doing good. That's actually a heresy. Yet, we have a tendency to think this way and easily fall into this trap.

In reality our faith is a relationship, which is covenantal. This is why I've been highlighting the imagery of our relationship as spousal. The first covenant was marriage. Marriage is all about love. We say God is love. Our relationship with God mirrors the love of God: faithful, free, total, and fruitful. And, as I said this past Sunday, it is expressed most fully on the Cross, which shows us love is sacrificial and is self-gift.

However, if we have made our relationship with Jesus nothing more than showing up to Mass each Sunday, but we never pray, we have no warmth or intimacy with God, then faith becomes empty and there is no true expression of love. The personal dimension of faith is essential to having faith at all. In fact, the beginning of living faith is this personal encounter with Jesus in which we accept him into our hearts. From this flows the fruit of the heart to evangelize and, secondarily, the desire to live out the Corporal Works of Mercy in serving others. To be clear, first and foremost, love of neighbor is sharing Jesus with others by evangelizing them about the saving work of Jesus Christ.


