Journey of Discipleship

In continuing our reflection upon personal encounters with Jesus, I want to point our attention to the end goal – entering into discipleship, then growing in that discipleship. To be clear, we cannot truly be disciples without first a personal encounter with Jesus.

In one way this seems obvious, but it also has not been the common language in our Catholic faith for a number of years. Or, at the least, we haven't talked about it enough. Remember, too, just because I've had a lifechanging encounter with Jesus, doesn't mean my faith is not at stake. It doesn't mean there is no way I will backtrack or even forget the encounter. The struggle of faith throughout all of scripture is one of memory-the memory of God working in my life.

Remember, Judas encountered Jesus and later rejected him. Peter encountered him, denied him, then came back to find a deeper encounter: "Peter, do you love me?" Likewise, this shows that it is not just a one-time event, but there will be many personal encounters with Jesus in our lifetime. There usually is an initial one that stands out as well as some other key moments later.

The past few popes have focused on this encounter, perhaps most profoundly when Pope Benedict XVI said: "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction." In other words, faith and the journey of discipleship begins with this encounter. Benedict goes on to say: "Christianity is not an intellectual system, a collection of dogmas, or a moralism. Christianity is an encounter, a love story; it is an event."

His words are expounding upon those of his predecessor, St. John Paul II who said: "It is Jesus that you seek when you dream of happiness. He is waiting for you when nothing else you find satisfies you. He is the beauty to which you are so attracted." St. John Paul II, in fact, said the goal of learning anything in our faith is to grow in intimacy with Jesus. In Catechesis Tradendae he wrote: "The definitive aim of catechesis is to put people not only in touch but in communion, in intimacy, with Jesus Christ: only He can lead us to the love of the Father in the Spirit and make us share in the life of the Holy Trinity."

Finally, Pope Francis said in his 2013 Holy Saturday homily: Let the risen Jesus enter your life, welcome him as a friend, with trust: he is life! If up till now you have kept him at a distance, step forward. He will receive you with open arms." Whatever distance we have created in how we live our faith, let us close the gap to begin the journey of discipleship.
