

# A Pastor & His Flock

With many priests transferring from one parish to another on July 1, I wanted to take a moment to address priest transfers. All of us have at some point experienced all that comes with this challenging change in leadership.

For us at St. Alphonsus and Blessed Sacrament parishes, we won't be going through a change this summer. That makes this a helpful moment to reflect as well as be of support to friends and family experiencing such a change. Hopefully my few words can help give direction on this.

Perhaps the most important thing is accepting the new priest for the gifts and talents he brings. Every priest brings certain strengths and has Godgiven gifts to share through his leadership. Instead, the tendency is to focus on the gifts the last priest had that the new one doesn't. However, that's not helpful, nor does it honor the newly assigned priest for the unique, God-given gifts he is bringing to the table. It is much better to spend our time looking at what is being gained by the new priest's gifts than focusing on the gifts being lost. If this is done well, the parish can build upon the new strengths being offered for the parish community to thrive. Ultimately, we should trust the Holy Spirit is sending a particular priest to serve the parish for a particular time and reason. Appointments are not merely human decisions, they are discerned and made with an obedience to the Holy Spirit.

Every person is different and made uniquely by God. Because he is different, the new priest will not necessarily be comfortable doing things the way they were done before. There needs to be a peaceful openness to change. Change is part of life and it is part of growing in faith. We should do our best to embrace changes and see them as opportunities for a newness of the Holy Spirit.

From this, it is important to show a clear sense of gratitude and affirmation of the many gifts the new priest is bringing (as well as expressing gratitude for the departing one). Along the way try not to only point out what you don't like--human nature is to be critical--but also affirm the ways the new priest is positively impacting the parish. Remember, it is the task of the pastor to set the tone and vision for the parish, which he does with great care and much prayer in order to lead his flock properly. He needs your prayers to see clearly the vision the Holy Spirit is showing him as well as your support to carry it out.

Lastly, there is a real temptation to follow a priest to a new assignment. This should be avoided. Our focus should be on Jesus Christ, not a particular priest and his personality. While these changes can be tremendously emotional and difficult, we must trust God is providing the shepherd we need.




