Let the Little Ones come to Me

I've received apologies on numerous occasions for loud children during Mass. These well meaning gestures are usually something like, "Father, I am so sorry about those distracting children. It must be difficult for you to keep focus up there." Typically, my response is that I didn't even notice. It's true.

Maybe it's a grace from God or my love of hearing children in their element, but I am sincere in saying it does not bother me and I am not distracted by young children screaming or making loud noises or running around during Mass. I am not writing this to condone their behavior, but to confirm the reality that parenting is tough (especially during Mass) and kids will be kids at times. I also realize we need to give a lot of grace to young families who may be struggling with multiple little ones during Mass.

Of course, every one parents a little differently. And children are different today than there were 15, 25, or more years ago. Also, we cannot judge certain behaviors, as a child may have developmental disabilities of which we are unaware. Ultimately, having some disruption of children during Mass is actually a sign of healthiness in the parish. It means we, as a Church, are raising up new little ones in the faith so that we can hand on to them what we ourselves have received.

For those distracted by the children, the crying and fidgeting can be a legitimate distraction. However, it is part of being church. Thus, we must learn how to deal with this reality properly and healthily. Embracing it is necessary toward being a hospitable parish. By the way, I intentionally use the word "hospitable" because the word "welcoming" has been often overused in our parish vocabulary and does not quite encompass what we should be striving for as we invite people into our buildings. More on that later.

As we continue to grow our parishes, my hope is more young families will get involved and become active members of these communities. This may mean more and more noise and distraction, but this ought to be seen as a great good and a sign of health and growth. Sacrifice is part of growing. Instead of judging or staying in negative spirits about it, I invite all of us to see the positive signs it brings. Consider offering in kind ways to show places where overly-disruptive children may be taken (the cry room at Blessed Sacrament and back/narthex of the Church at St. Alphonsus).

You may also want to offer to help a struggling parent with his or her children. Most parishioners are parents and/or have the skills to help with difficult children and situations. Remember, we are a family, so we should offer to support each other as members of that family.




