#### **UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS**

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

#### Daniel 7:13-14

# "His dominion is an everlasting dominion, his kingship shall not be destroyed."

In Daniel's vision, the "one like a Son of man...reached the Ancient One and was presented before him." Christ is returning to the Father and receiving "dominion, glory and kingship", everlasting kingship that "shall not be destroyed."

The final kingdom and its prophecies have not yet been fulfilled. We must, in some way, be part of that kingdom.

Jesus came the first time to die for our sins. He will come again on the day of judgement to subdue his enemies and establish his kingdom.

Daniel's vision is prophecy revealed to us so that we can see things through God's eyes because our own vision is limited by our human eyes. Scripture is God's way of telling us what God will do. What God says, God does.

Let us listen, then, and be sober, enduring the sufferings and trials sent our way, knowing the certainty of His kingdom to come.



#### Revelation 1:5-8

# "To him who loves us...be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen."

Anticipation threaded through the book of Revelation. The God of this book was a deity who was active in human events. He was a power of nature that could be neither appeased nor manipulated. He was alive in human history.

Revelation dared to see events as if they occurred in the very presence of God. But, in our humanity, the only way for us to witness the events in the presence of God is through worship.

Imagine, for a moment, the final judgment was in progress. We stand among the angels in heaven, praising God for all he was doing. How would we see the events of the end times, as they unfold in real time?

According to Revelation, we would see the coming of the Christ, even those guilty of his death. And all would mourn at the sight of his glory, from guilt, from dread of judgment, or both.


The Lord God calls himself the "Alpha and the Omega", he who was and he who is to come.

Once again, we are to anticipate the return of Christ. We can do so through our worship in this world as we wait to see God in the next.

#### John 18:33-37

"You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world...Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

As Roman governor of Judea, Pilate was judge and jury in capital cases. His question was direct: "Do you claim to be king?" An affirmative answer would have sealed the fate of Jesus, since he would be branded as a political revolutionary.



But the phrase "King of the Jews" had a spiritual meaning that might have escaped Pilate. To probe Pilate's understanding, Jesus answers a question with a question: "Who are your witnesses about me?" Pilate retorts with a question: "What have you done?" In other words, Pilate wants Jesus to be the witness, not his accusers.

Jesus responds with a speech about his kingdom. Jesus' kingdom is not that of popular culture or politics.

Pilate still presses the point: "You are a king, aren't you?" to which Jesus concedes a semantic point by saying, "You're the one who says so, Pilate." But finally Jesus does give Pilate direct witness and speaks the truth.

Jesus speaks the truth and the "world" speaks a different truth. The truth of the world is transient in nature; it changes with the season and the political landscape. It speaks to ambition and power, to possessions and pleasure. The truth of the world is, at best, shallow.

But the truth Jesus speaks is that of the heart. The truth of Jesus is more than facts; it is one of fidelity. God is "true" to us; that means, he is faithful. He shows us his fidelity through his Son and the power of his Spirit. When we are true to God in return, we "live in truth." Since God is eternally faithful, God's truth goes beyond the transient nature of politics, fad, and fashion.

The world's truth can fail us. God's truth sustains us.

The reality of Jesus' kingship is in his truth. Jesus is Lord. His kingdom awaits.
