UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Baruch 5:1-9

"...see your children...rejoicing that they are remembered by God."

Today's reading speaks of hope in God's mercy and justice.

Baruch foretells that Jerusalem will return from exile to a new intimacy with God.

How will Jerusalem remain close to God? By acting in justice so as to give true worship, free of corruption and full of compassion. As long as Jerusalem holds close to God, the Lord will return the favor and increase the "splendor" of Jerusalem. If Jerusalem was just, its Temple would spread knowledge of God. The Temple would be a beacon for God's glory and a viewing point for coming worshipers, Jewish and non-Jewish alike. God's word would be heard and Jerusalem's children would gather, rejoicing that they are remembered by God.

Even today, Christians give God glory primarily through acts of justice and mercy. In the season of waiting, let us not forget the less fortunate. Let us act with justice and mercy.

Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11

"And this is my prayer: that your love may increase ever more...so that you may be pure and blameless for the day of Christ..."

The blessing from Paul's letter to the Philippians was a poignant display of affection. While Paul was in prison at Ephesus, he wrote to the community he established and nurtured. His language was remarkable. The relationship he had with the community at Philippi was based on a sense of shared mission. They had a partnership with Paul in spreading the Gospel both in God's grace and in suffering. Many scholars hold this partnership was based upon the continued generosity of the Philippians to Paul. When Paul remembered the community, especially in prayer, it was a joy-filled memory. And he yearned to rejoin them at the earliest moment, if only he could.

"Prepare the way of the Lord. Make straight his paths...all flesh shall see the salvation of God"

John brought together historical significance and prophetic tradition. Like Elijah, he ministered in the desert. Like Isaiah, he foretold coming events.

Through John, we learned that God was about to do something new, unique, different. John stood in the shadows of the past, but pointed to future events.

As the year ends, we look back to the past for comfort and reflection. But we look forward to the coming of One Greater. Let us use this time to "Get ready."



SURVEY RESULTS



The Parish Council and I are meeting regularly. One of the many items on the agenda for our most recent meeting was the results of the parish survey regarding consolidation of Sunday Masses. I am grateful to all those who took the time to indicate which Mass they prefer to attend.

The results were fairly spread out among the Masses. There was no clear consensus on which Mass could be eliminated.

What **WAS** clear was that a majority of the respondents were **NOT** registered at Epiphany. A registered parishioner is one whose donations are given through ParishPay or the envelope system.

Parish registration is important for many reasons. I urge those who are not registered to stand up and be counted as one who identifies with this parish and our community. Registering is all about your sense of belonging and connectedness to this Church.

How can we survive as a parish church if we do not even know who half our members are? I hope that everyone at Epiphany will register through ParishPay.com or the envelope system. Please?

Also, if you give through ParishPay as I do, you can pick up a card each time you enter church and place it into the basket at collection time. This eliminates the awkwardness you may feel when the basket passes you by.

Pray for your council and me as we deliberate what is best for our parish and what we need to do to make it stronger.






