

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Zephaniah 3:14-18a

"The Lord, your God...will rejoice over you with gladness and renew you in his love..."


Today's reading reminds us of the joy we will feel when God is with us. Zephaniah presents an image of Jerusalem as a young girl who should be at a party. The danger has passed. The enemies are gone. It is time for rejoicing because God is in their midst. Not only does the city have cause for rejoicing, the prophet loudly proclaims God's joy over the return of his people. God and the people are together; they are reconciled. There is true joy.



Tomorrow, on Advent Reconciliation Monday, we can draw closer to God and rejoice with Him in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Philippians 4:4-7 "Rejoice in the Lord always. I say again: rejoice!"

Jesus will come to us soon. We celebrate his birth at Christmas and we await his second coming at the end of days. Our waiting time can be filled with anxiety or joy.



Paul gave us this choice. If we await with apprehension, we will not feel the gladness God's coming will bring. Joyful anticipation leads to peace, both for us and for the people in our lives. Joy is never assertive or destructive. It is a gift from God. Joy from God is based in a peace that transcends the limitation of the human mind and heart. If we want to experience God's peace, we must open ourselves up to his presence and accept his gift of joy.

So take the time, slow down. Enjoy the season. Pray in the spirit of thanks for the season. Let God give you his peace.

Luke 3:10-18

"...one mightier than I is coming. He will baptize you in the Holy Spirit and fire."

In this reading, John the Baptist acts in his role as a visionary of future events and encourages the people to exercise their moral conscience. He urges his audience to practical, moral change that would enhance the common good. He then points to One Greater than he: the Messiah.

At the time of John and Jesus, Jews expected four different types of Messiahs. First, a militant messiah to lead them against the Romans; second, a great high priest who would banish corruption from the temple and restore pure worship; third, a great teacher like Moses to explain the Law and lead them in God's ways. All of these Messiahs would rise from among the people.

The last Messiah would appear from nowhere, the "Son of Man" whose authority would come from God himself. He would be God's agent of judgement. This is the Messiah prophesied by John as the "One Greater."

John's encouragement to a moral conscience asks us to prepare ourselves for the coming by becoming what God expects us to be. We are asked to share clothing and food, to practice justice, to maintain personal and professional integrity, to be honest and respectful.

Why the fearful image of unquenchable fire that will accompany the bestowing of the Holy Spirit? How is this "Good News?" This <u>IS</u> Good News because being saved through God's judgement is worth the fearful cost.

Jesus encouraged us in the readings two weeks ago (Luke 21:34-36) to pray for strength during the test and for fortitude to stand before the Son of Man at the Last Judgement. The joy to follow will be well worth whatever fear we suffer.



In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, we can enhance our moral conscience with practical acts of charity, forgiveness, and compassion - all acts of mercy.


