

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Micah 5:1-4a "He shall stand firm and shepherd his flock..."

Today's reading is about Bethlehem in the midst of foreign invasion. As a prophet, Micah condemned the city for its sins, but promised a time of renewed glory. The restoration would begin in most insignificant of places, just as David, Israel's greatest king, came from the shepherding fields around a small village.

Such would be the case for the coming Messiah, Israel's leader at the end of time. He would seem to come from nowhere, yet his lineage would be from ancient times. His arrival would be humble, yet his pedigree would be impeccable.

Until his time, Israel would be scattered among the nations. But his birth would be the sign of Israel's return to its homeland.

The coming Messiah would rule like a shepherd, in God's name, with strength from the Father. So great would his reign be, that it will extend to the ends of the earth. His rule will peaceful as he watches over his flock the way a shepherd guards his sheep.

Jesus was born in the smallest of places, did not travel more than 50 miles from his home in his life, left no personal writing, and his death was as humbling as his birth. Yet the vision of God's kingdom was fulfilled in his coming. His life and death changed the world.

Hebrews 10:5-10 "Behold, I come to do your will, O God."

As the feast of Christmas approaches, the most important question is, "Why did Jesus come?"

Paul's letter to the Hebrews answers the question with the words Christ spoke, "I come to do your will, O God."

When Paul's words were written, the Romans had destroyed the holy temple of the Jews and had reduced Jerusalem to rubble. Both Jews and Jewish Christians mourned the loss and felt they had failed in their attempt to build temples to God and to create ceremonies in his praise.

Paul recalls to the Hebrews the words of Jesus as a reminder to them that sacrifices and temples are less important than doing the will of God. Their offering should be themselves in service of God's will.

Temples were built and destroyed. The priesthood of Aaron was a failure, because it was repetitive and ineffective. But Christ, the eternal High Priest, came to offer his body as a way to do God's will...the ultimate and perfect sacrifice.

Why did Christ come? To say "Yes" to God and to offer himself to the Father. During this season of Advent and in celebrating the birth of our Savior, we are inspired to do the same. By his death, Christ gave us life. We can use that life to serve others, not only during the Christmas season, but all our time on earth.

Luke 1:39-45

"Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb."

Luke used an insignificant meeting between two pregnant women in order to connect two of the most important movements in first century Judaism: the followers of John the Baptist and the disciples of Jesus.

Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, represented the open, trusting tradition of the female in Judaism. Just as the elderly Sarah became the mother of Isaac and the old Hannah became the mother of Samuel, Elizabeth could rejoice in the birth of a son, even at an old age.

The Blessed Virgin Mary represented a new revelation. God was entering the human stage not only with a new message, but in a completely new way! Through Mary, God sent his son into the world.



When Elizabeth greeted Mary and recognized the Messiah in Mary's womb they were filled with the Holy Spirit and with joyful anticipation of the fulfilment of God's promise to send a Savior. What a marvelous wonder for God to fill not only Elizabeth's heart with his Holy Spirit but the child in her womb as well! John the Baptist, even before the birth of the Messiah, anticipated his coming and leapt for joy in the womb of his mother as the Holy Spirit revealed to him the presence of the King to be born. The Holy Spirit is God's gift to us to enable us to know and experience the indwelling presence of God and the power of his kingdom. The Holy Spirit is the way in which God reigns within each of us.

Lord, fill me with your Holy Spirit and give me joy in seeking you more closely. Increase my faith in all your promises, my hope in the joys of heaven.
