

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14

"Whoever honors his father...when he prays, he is heard..."

Sirach (also known as "Ecclesiasticus") is a book of wisdom, a text book to train young men in Jerusalem. The book praised wisdom and gave advice for a moral life, especially regarding interpersonal and family relationships. These verses addressed the duty a son owed his parents.

Notice the verses expound upon the Fourth Commandment. Sirach revealed the esteem placed upon the extended family as the pillar of society. Honoring one's parents was the most important of the commandments that addressed human affairs. Sirach taught that honoring parents was a sign of righteousness. It forgave sin. It was a means of divine blessing, of having one's prayers heard by God. The patience required for the care of elderly parents would strengthen character. And God would look with compassion upon the son offering such care.

Ancient cultures like that in Judea were family-oriented and elderly-centered. Our modern society often neglects the moral directive of the Fourth Commandment. What was then an obligation is simply an option in the modern world. Yet, the advice given in Sirach is as meaningful today as it was over two millennia ago. Honoring our parents creates strong families and strong societies.

Colossians 3:12-21 "As the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do."

In today's reading, Paul reminds us that we are God's chosen ones and we must, therefore, "put on...heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience" as a garment, "...bearing with one another and forgiving one another...as the Lord has forgiven you, so must you also do."

Our Christmas celebration brought us the familiar songs and readings that have cheered and comforted us all our lives. Paul asks us to accept the peace that we receive in Christ and to be grateful to God as we are enriched in the wisdom of the psalms and hymns.

Let us keep the joy of Christmas in our hearts throughout the year. "Whatever [we] do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord."

FORGIVE AND FORGET

According to Carl Thoresen, Ph.D., professor of education, psychology, and psychiatry, and principal investigator, Stanford Forgiveness Project, Stanford University, California—"People who forgive and forget enjoy better physical and emotional health than their grudge-holding peers. Grudge-holders tend to be angry and fearful. These emotions can cause heart rate and blood pressure to rise. Over time, this can lead to heart attack, stroke, and other ailments. Forgiveness should extend to oneself as well as to others."


Luke 2:41-52

"Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"

The hallmark of Jesus' life before his baptism was silence. He lived an ordinary life, doing what ordinary people did at the time. He was a Jew, obedient to his faith, his family, and his profession. In that way, Jesus lived as we live. The silence of his early years stressed his solidarity with our human condition. But that silence also sowed the seeds of his ministry, his obedience to the Father.

While Jesus might have been an enfranchised Jewish male, he, as the only Son of God, was among us to do the will of his Father. Jesus did not really belong to the clan from Nazareth. He belonged to his true Father. Jesus' place was in the Father's house. Jesus' mission was to teach the people the way back to the Father. He amazed the teachers just as he would amaze the people along his mission road. But Joseph and Mary did not understand his reasoning.

The tension between the parents and the child began to fulfill the prophecy Simeon made to Mary and foreshadowed Jesus' death and resurrection. The search caused Mary pain and anxiety as one of the swords that pierced her heart. The climax of the story occurred three days after the celebration of Passover, a foreshadowing of the Resurrection.



Despite the confrontation, Jesus grew in honor (wisdom, size, and reputation). Jesus was a faithful Jew as he honored his parents and obeyed the Fourth Commandment. He existed within the old, the Jewish tradition. But all signs pointed to the new. He was the Messiah. And he would reveal God acting in a new way, with a new people.
