

#### **UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS**

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

#### Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8 "Here I am...send me!"

Unlike any other prophet, Isaiah receives his prophetic call in a vision during Temple worship.



He sees the Seraphim as they avert their eyes from the blinding glory of God and he hears them praising God with "Hosannas". The earth shook in response to the power of God's divine presence.

Isaiah was fearful because God's presence made him aware of his own sinfulness. He knew he needed to be cleansed in order to answer God's call to prophesy. By cleansing his lips with a burning ember, the Seraphim rendered Isaiah worthy to serve God as his prophet.

He hears the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" Isaiah answers, "Here I am. Send me."

During the approaching season of Lent, we do penance in order to become worthy of God's redemption so that, like Isaiah, we can say, "Here I am, Lord."



#### 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

# "...whether it be I or they (the apostles), so we preach and so you believed."

In today's reading, once again, Paul tries to re-focus the Corinthian Christians on the Good News – that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and was raised from the dead on the third day – all according to scripture.

At the time of Corinthians, there were still people among the living who had seen the risen Christ. Paul, himself, had encountered the Risen Lord on the road to Damascus. That encounter changed Paul from a zealous Pharisee who lived in obedience the secular law to a committed follower of Christ who lived in obedience to God's law. He, like all who encountered the Risen Lord, strove to be the face of Christ to others.

As Paul and his fellow witnesses to the Risen Lord went out into the world, they didn't simply preach; they proclaimed. Their ministry was to carry the Good News and to live the Gospel that they brought. By their evangelization, they inspired others to believe and to live the in the presence of Christ. The ongoing chain of experiences traced from the apostles and others who saw the Risen Lord, through the generations that followed, all the way to present-day followers of Christ.

Still today, our primary mission as Christians is to be Christ to the world. Paul's message to the Corinthians could not be more relevant today:

"So we preach and so you believed."

Today's Psalm: 138

In the sight of the angels
I will sing your praises, Lord.

#### Luke 5:1-11

# "Do not be afraid...they left everything and followed him."

Luke enfolded a fish story that turns common sense upside down. To maximize a catch, fishing was done at night when water was cool and the activity of the fish was minimal. During the day, the fish would see the activity of the boats on the surface and, with the water warming, would easily swim away.

Astonished by the size of the catch, Simon realized the power and presence of God before him. He begged Jesus to leave because he acknowledged himself as a sinful man. Before the sign, Simon had his life laid before him: a fisherman who would live and die by the Sea of Galilee. After the sign, he recognized Christ's invitation to a new life that would demand fundamental changes in the life he had lived until then.



An encounter with God is an experience that transcends our human perceptions. Moses encountered God in the burning bush. When asked for a name, God responded, "I Am who I Am." The name itself described the unknowable, yet it also revealed God's eternal presence. He who was beyond all understanding would be close, present to whom he revealed himself. Moses understood that God always was and always would be present. God was eternally transcendent, yet eternally imminent. An encounter with such a reality demanded a response. It could not be ignored.

An encounter with God transcends, not just our understanding, but our expectations. Simon could never have anticipated that he would receive a call from God. Yet, he was invited by Jesus to reach within and beyond himself and follow the Lord.

More often than we realize, we receive a call from God. Sometimes our hand is guided to pick up a book that is just what we needed to read at that moment. Sometimes a person crosses our path who brings us the very peace we had been seeking. Sometimes we are awakened by the words of a reading or homily that seems to have been written just for us. That is God whispering to us in our noisy, busy world. We sometimes need to lower the volume of life so that we can hear God's whispers.
