

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

"To your descendants I give this land, from the Wadi of Egypt to the Great River, the Euphrates."

How do we know God is really present? When we have an experience that changes us. The experience can be a as small as a new feeling or insight, or as grand as a vision. We measure the experience, not by its depth, but by the extent it changes us.

Abraham had a grand vision, but the way it changed him was found in God's gift: descendants and land.

Descendants were important to Abraham - to help him in his work and to provide him with "immortality".

Who was this God promising Abraham descendants and land? Abraham's God was the God who was closest to him and could deliver on His promises. This was the God in whom Abraham put his trust.

The vision that God showed to Abraham was similar to an earthly covenant made by a king to a faithful servant. The covenant was an act of gracious gift giving; all obligations and penalties of the covenant were adopted by the king, not by the servant.

In making this covenant with Abraham, God was making the promise that He alone would assume the penalty for breaking the covenant. God was putting his reputation on the line as a deity; if He could not deliver on his promises, He was not worthy of Abraham's trust.

While feeling, insight, and the unexplainable might be measures of God's presence, personal change is a better measure. For Abraham, the change was descendants and land; for us, the change is Church, a place and a community in which to grow closer to God. And these changes are gifts from God.

Philippians 3:20-4:1 "...stand firm in the Lord."

As in many of Paul's letters to the early Christians, he reminds them that they had received the only gift that is important to their lives - the gift of Christ's sacrifice, which enables us to become citizens in heaven.

Paul assures the followers of Christ that the Gentile Christians received the same gift of salvation as the Jewish Christians. He instructed all the new Christians that, while following Jewish laws governing diet and circumcision provided a sense of self-sacrifice, these laws should not be allowed to become more important than their new Christian faith. Man-made laws help to create order and can aid in development of virtue, but faith is a gift from God that blesses our lives.

Paul knew that there was nothing greater than the salvation made possible by the Risen Christ and the faith he gave us to sustain our daily lives.

Today's Psalm: 27

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Luke 9:28b-36 "This is my chosen Son. Listen to him."

Several verses earlier in Luke's gospel, Jesus revealed the type of Messiah he would be, predicting his own death and resurrection. In today's gospel, he asks his disciples to pray with him. It was time for the power and meaning of his prediction to be made more understandable to them.



When Moses and Elijah appeared with the glorified Jesus, they represented the two divisions of Jewish Scripture, the Law and the Prophets. The conversation among the three about Jesus' coming death foretold the Passion as the fulfillment of Scripture.

Jesus revealed all the symbols needed to understand his message: the light, the central focus on Jesus, climbing the mountain to worship.

Did Peter, James and John fully understand the meaning and implication of Jesus' prediction? Unfortunately, they were asleep, both literally and figuratively. This was a foreshadowing of the same sleep that overcame the apostles during Jesus' Agony in the Garden. The disciples, as humans, were still unable to understand that they had been shown the future - the Son of God transfigured by his resurrection from the dead. But this vision of the future required the gift of faith that Peter had yet to receive. The transfigured Christ was lost on this all too human disciple.

Finally, the revelation receives the confirmation of the Father in the words, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." God revealed the future of salvation through the Law and the Prophets and now through Jesus. Christ's death and resurrection and our salvation were imminent.
