



is not a place away from noise, trouble, and hard work. It is a place in the midst of those things where we can still be calm in our hearts.

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Acts 10:34a, 37-43

"...everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins through his name."

Peter's speech emerges in the midst of a rather long narrative around the encounter between Peter and Cornelius, the centurion. Peter came to the house of Cornelius, a "righteous Gentile," to preach the Good News.

For Luke, this moment is significant well beyond Peter's life. This story is a powerful symbol of a promise enunciated from the beginning of Luke's gospel and throughout Acts, a promise represented most powerfully in the resurrection of Jesus. Without question, God's spirit is moving.

Peter used personal witness as a bridge between the events of Galilee and Jerusalem and again to stress the reality of the resurrection. Personal witness became God's commission to preach Jesus as Lord. Along with personal testimony, the apostles had Scriptural and traditional standing and the "prophets" witnessed in Scripture long before Jesus' time among men. The message from the apostles and the prophets was clear: that everyone who believes in Christ would receive the forgiveness that God offered to all.

By entering the house of a Gentile, no matter how righteous, Peter made himself ritually impure. But this was of little concern to Peter. He was there to proclaim the Good News. In Isaiah, God said, "See, I am doing something

new!" The Good News that Peter proclaimed was part of that "something new" – the forgiveness that Christ's sacrifice on the cross brought to all the world, Jews and Gentiles alike. Salvation is a gift for us all.

Colossians 3:1-4

"...seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God."

The authorship of this letter to the Colossians is sometimes disputed. But whether it came from Paul or one of his followers, the gift of the Risen Christ is its message.

The letter begins with the assumption that the Colossians had already received Christ's risen life. They are now encouraged to think differently, to seek and think of what is above, not of what is on earth, and to act accordingly.

But even with this new life within them, the new Christians must still await the fullness of life in Christ, which would come when he returned in glory. Until then, Christians had to wait. The seeds of his glory were present and active, but not fully revealed.

Today's Psalm: 118

This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

John 20:1-9

"For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead."

The resurrection scene from John's gospel emphasizes the empty tomb as a reason for faith. The "disciple whom Jesus loved" did not need the appearance of Jesus himself to believe that Christ

had risen. Later, the vision of the risen Lord would cause others to believe.

John's purpose in his narrative of the resurrection is not only to establish that it happened, but also to depict the gradual growth of faith in the resurrection among the disciples. This passage contains two main incidents. First there is Mary's skeptical reaction at the tomb, assuming that "they" have taken the Lord and "put him" somewhere. Next, the arrival of Peter and John at the tomb shows faith on two levels: the slowly dawning faith of Peter and the immediate faith of the beloved disciple upon seeing that the Lord

John believed immediately when he saw that the burial garments had been laid aside because Jesus no longer needed them as he rose calmly and deliberately in his lordship over death.

But Peter still was in the dark. Just as John had outrun his friend, his more sensitive nature, not to say his deeper love - that would be unjust, since their love of the Lord differed in quality more than in degree - had gifted John with a more subtle and swifter-working perception. Perhaps if Peter's heart had not been oppressed by his denial of Jesus, he would have been readier to feel the sunshine of the wonderful hope. It is so very human to condemn ourselves to the shade when we deny our Lord by deed or word.

The most important message of all of today's readings is that the Risen Christ brought the gift of salvation to the sinner and the virtuous, the swift and the slow, the skeptic and the believer. In the Risen Christ we have faith that we can rise with him and "appear with him in glory."
