UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41 "God exalted him ...to grant Israel repentance and forgiveness of sins."

As directed by Jesus, the apostles continued his work after his resurrection with their healing ministry and their presence in the Temple.

The Sanhedrin, the highest religious authority in Jerusalem, commanded the apostles to stop preaching, but they ignored the court's order. In fact, they accused the Sanhedrin of murdering Jesus.

The apostles' answer was simple: they answered to a higher power. In obedience to the Spirit, the apostles acted as witnesses, proclaiming what they had seen. God had raised Jesus and made him Savior so that Israel might repent and receive forgiveness. In essence, Peter declared that God had taken away the authority of the Sanhedrin and had given it to the Church. In the eyes of the leadership, this was an act of religious treason.

Missing from today's reading is the Sanhedrin's desire to punish the apostles with death. A Pharisee named Gamaliel defused the situation by pointing out that, if the apostles' work was human in origin, it would fade away as any movement in the past. "But," he told them, "if it is from God, you will not be able to stop them; you will only find yourselves fighting against God."

Instead of putting them to death, the Sanhedrin had the apostles flogged and released. The apostles rejoiced that they had been found worthy to suffer dishonor in the name of Jesus.



Revelation 5:11-14
"Worthy is the
Lamb that was
slain...To
the ...Lamb be
blessing and honor,
glory and might
forever and ever."

This reading is one of great joy, of angels singing, with the elders of

the church and all living creature crying out the praises of the Lamb who was slain and rose to sit on the throne of God.

It is a joy to all the world, to see that God dealt with man in grace and mercy through the Redeemer. He governs the world, not merely as a Creator, but as our Savior.

Christ has redeemed his people from the bondage of sin, guilt, and Satan. He has not only purchased liberty for them, but has made them kings and priests; kings, to rule over their own spirits, and to overcome the world and the evil one; and has made them priests, giving them access to himself and liberty to offer up spiritual sacrifices.

In Revelation, John declares that Christ is to be worshipped - equally with the Father - by all creatures - to all eternity. Happy is all creation who shall adore and praise in heaven, and happy are we who have been delivered and set apart for himself by his blood.

Today's Psalm: 30

I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.

John 21:1-19 or 1-14 "Do you love me?...Feed my lambs...Tend my sheep."

Like much of John's writing, today's gospel is full of symbolism. The disciples got into a boat to go fishing at night. The boat was an old symbol for the church. Fishing at night represented a failing missionary effort. The disciples were in the dark as they were on the night Jesus was dead in the tomb. But with the dawn, the Risen Lord was present, and with him came the great number of fish, representing the new Christians. With the great catch, the Lord was recognized.



Peter tucked his garment, symbolizing his readiness to work, and rushed to meet the Lord. The disciples pitched in to bring the catch to land. On the shore, they found Jesus had prepared them a

breakfast of bread and fish, a meal in the tradition of the early Christians. The Lord ate with them as proof of his resurrection.

The meal represented the initiation of Christians being incorporated into Christ. It was the image of the Eucharist in reverse – instead of the disciples consuming Christ in the Eucharist, the new believers were consumed by Christ. The inclusion of new believers into the Body of Christ brought new life.

Finally, Peter is led three times to confess his love for the Lord. It was Peter's opportunity to expiate his sin of having denied Christ three times. Peter is then directed three times by the Lord to "feed my lambs" and "tend my sheep." So Peter has been given his command - to follow Christ and lead the new Christian people. Jesus then confirms that, by fulfilling the mandate of a Christian's life of faith and service, consequences would follow, foretelling a death for Peter that would be similar to his own.
