<u>From an interview with Cardinal Dolan</u> <u>"It's About Marriage, Not Divorce"</u>

"My major concern is that we can't allow this one issue, as important as it is, to eclipse the fact that the major and most urgent mandate for the Church is to reclaim the beauty and nobility of the sacrament of marriage and family life."

"When you have a Church that says that family is actually the reflection of the life of the Holy Trinity, when you have a Church that says that the love expressed between a man and a woman in marriage is a reflection of God's passion and eternal life, that's magic, but most people don't hear that, most people don't believe that."

<u>Quotes from Pope Francis in his encyclical</u> <u>Amoris Laetitia ("The Joy of Love")</u>

"I feel it urgent to state that, if the family is the sanctuary of life, the place where life is conceived and cared for, it is a horrendous contradiction when it becomes a place where life is rejected and destroyed. So great is the value of a human life, and so inalienable the right to life of an innocent child growing in its mother's womb, that no alleged right to one's own body can justify a decision to terminate that life, which is an end in itself and which can never be considered the 'property' of another human being."

"Divorce is an evil and the increasing number of divorces is very troubling. Hence our most important pastoral task with regard to families is to strengthen their love, helping to heal wounds, and working to prevent the spread of this drama of our times."

"There is a need for continued open discussion of a number of doctrinal, moral, spiritual, and pastoral questions."

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Acts 15:1-2, 22-29

"If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell."

Paul's missionary journey continues – as do the growing pains of the new Church.

Communication problems today sometimes arise from information being passed too quickly without allowing time for thoughtful understanding. Paul's problem was the opposite. There was sometimes too *much* time between his messages to the new Christians. During those gaps in time, other disciples brought their own messages and upset the new converts, both Jews and Gentiles.

There was great resistance among Jewish converts who wanted to preserve some of their own laws and customs, like circumcision and the many Judaic dietary laws. They wanted the Gentiles to become Jews first, and then to convert to Christianity. The Gentiles did not find it necessary to follow a path through Judaism in order to become followers of Christ.

The missionary message from the appointed disciples, Paul and Barnabas, Judas and Silas, was simple. They reassured the converts by telling them that the Holy Spirit would not place burdens on them. They explained that the new Christians were to abstain from certain dietary practices and from unlawful marriage. "If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell."

Revelation 21:1-5a

"The glory of God gave it light and its lamp was the Lamb."

The Old Testament foretold the future, and when Christ came into the world, he fulfilled the scripture and gave insight and understanding to the prophecy. Once Christ was among us, the scripture had perspective that allowed us to understand its lessons. The New Testament, then, tells the story of Christ in the world and his return to the Father. The story of Christ's time on earth is one we can understand.


Now comes Revelation, a book of visions and symbols, of significant numbers, of reminders of the prophecies from the Old Testament. John sees a vision of Jerusalem, the City of God, coming down out of heaven. This shining city of Jerusalem is a symbol of the Church, God's presence in the world.

The number twelve appears often: twelve angels, twelve city gates, the twelve tribes of Israel, twelve layers of stone in the foundation, the twelve apostles of the Lamb. This number, indicating fullness and completion, also appeared in early scripture and later in the stories of Christ in the world; now, here it is again in Revelation. The twelve apostles, as the human foundation of our church, are like twelve layers of stone. The twelve gates, inscribed with the names of the twelve tribes, symbolize a welcome to all people from all directions, just as, in our Church, we are mandated to welcome all people.

We receive the fullness and perfection of God in our Church on earth. There is no need for a temple, "for its temple is the Lord God almighty and the Lamb." There is "no need for sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb."

Today's Psalm: 67
O God, O God,
let all the nations praise you!

John 13:31-33a, 34-35 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you...Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."



In today's Gospel, Jesus has so much to tell his disciples. It seems he is repeating all his messages at once because he knows he will ascend to the Father very soon. There were so many things to tell these all-too-human disciples before he left.

The gifts of love and peace and our obligation to the Father were Christ's essential message.


Love from the Father, who sent his only Son that we might be saved.

Peace from the Holy Spirit, another gift from the Father. Peace - not simply the absence of conflict, but that inner sense that everything in the world is right with God – not the transitory peace offered by the world, but God's peace to remain with us forever.

The obligation Christ places on us is that we must keep the word of God - If we love Christ and the Father, if we call ourselves Christians, we must keep his words.

Jesus finished with a warning and a promise. Bad times and spiritual distance would occur. But his peace and love would remain. Christians should not be surprised they were not popular. Nor should they worry Jesus had abandoned them, just because he lived with the Father. The price of true peace comes from the perseverance of

faith in the face of spiritual distance and persecution.



To quote a passage from Luke's gospel, "to whom much is given, much will be required." The message is much the same from John today. With gratitude and obedience, we earn and enjoy the gifts of Love, Peace, and Salvation from our Father.
