

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Acts 7:55-60

"But they...covered their ears and rushed upon him together."

Today's reading from Acts describes the death of Stephen, the first Christian martyr. As one of the first deacons of the emerging Church in Jerusalem, Stephen was a witness to the Good News, which threatened the entrenched leaders of the traditional Jews. Stephen was brought before judges to answer charges similar to the ones that had been leveled against Jesus, among them, blasphemy, punishable by death. Stephen's acceptance of his martyrdom is a reminder of the way Jesus met his own death, commending his spirit to God and asking forgiveness of his executioners.

Most notable in this reading is the appearance of Saul of Tarsus, a young man who was committed to wiping out the new Christian church. Saul had yet to encounter God on the road to Damascus and the violent strike and subsequent vision that would bring about his conversion into one of Christ's greatest disciples. Saul was chosen by God as his instrument to deliver the Gospel to the Gentiles, their kings and all Israel, but for the moment, he was a witness and participant in the stoning of Stephen, the first Christian martyr.

Eventually, Paul himself was martyred for his Christian faith during the reign of the Roman emperor, Nero.



Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17, 20 "Behold, I am coming soon. I bring with me the recompense I will give to each according to his deeds."

In the words of Revelation 22, heaven is not a right. It is a gift that is offered by invitation. We are invited! "Come." Let the one who thirsts come forward and the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water.

Today's verses end the apocalyptic book of Revelation. Between witness – those who knew Christ on earth – and the second coming – that which will come at the end of time – Jesus gave John the Elder a message about himself and foretold what was to come for the faithful.

Those who have washed their robes are invited to the tree of life, to enter the gates of the New Jerusalem, based upon their faithfulness to God. This invitation is a call to a closer walk with the Lord.

We all imagine how heaven will be. We envision our departed loved ones already there, living as a part of God's presence. There is really no way for a human imagination to know heaven as it will be at the end of time. We have only the invitation to eternal life with God, ensured by our faithfulness to him.

God is the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end. We will understand this if we accept God's invitation to faithfulness and eternal reward.

Today's Psalm: 97

The Lord is king, the most high over all the earth

John 13:31-33a, 34-35 "I wish that where I am they also may be with me..."



Today's Gospel is a prayer for unity. Jesus prays fervently to his Father. He prays for "them", whose words will bring others to believe and to be as one, as Christ is one with his Father. If we are unified as believers in Christ, we will also be one with Christ and his Father.

Jesus has prayed for himself before. He has prayed for his original disciples before. In *today's* Gospel, he prays for the generations of believers yet to come. The Father's truth came to us in the person of his beloved Son, sent to bring salvation to the world. The Son's truth comes to us through his word, delivered by "them", the disciples who knew Christ as a man. We are part of the later generations who know Christ through his words.

On the last evening of Jesus' earthly life, he prayed for future generations of believers like us, that his word would bring us to live as one with him.

As individual Christians and as a Church, our vision is to transcend the present, reaching those who will come after us. Our unity with one another today can extend past our lifetimes. Christ prayed that we would all be one, as he was with the Father, that we "may be brought to perfection as one..."

In his prayer, Jesus called us a gift from the Father to the Son. He wants us to be with him always, to be one with him and his Father. It is our journey, our duty, our gift, that Christ gave us his words, his way to be with him always.
