

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Acts 2:1-11

"...yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the might acts of God."

Breathing and life go hand-in-hand. We might take both for granted, but if we deny our breath, we will quickly become sharply focused on our life.

To ancient people, breathing was a sign of the spirit, a person's life force. In fact, spiritus (Latin), pneuma (Greek), and ruah (Hebrew) all mean breath and spirit.

When applied to the gods, these words mean breeze or wind, which, to the ancients, were the result of God's breathe. In Genesis 1:2, God breathed his Spirit upon the waters as a mighty wind and life began. By breathing, God gave life to the world.

Among Jews, the once agricultural feast of Pentecost celebrated the reception of God's Law on Mt. Sinai. Luke changed this feast into the reception of the Spirit by Christians. God's breathe filled the house like a mighty wind, and new life began in the followers of Jesus.

Then, flames spread over the followers like a wind driven wild fire. This was a sign of enlightenment (fire in the mind) and passion (fire in the belly). With insight and motivation, the followers of Jesus began to spread the Good News.

As a center for worship on a major feast day, Jerusalem swelled with visitors from all parts of the world. These visitors mixed with locals and, in multicultural gatherings, heard the proclamation of God's great acts in their native tongues. God had given the proclaimers the gift of tongues so that were clearly understood.

At the first Christian Pentecost, God breathed his Spirit and changed the followers of Jesus. They were new creatures, filled with God's very Spirit. With their words proclaiming God's mighty acts, Jesus' followers breathed God's Spirit onto others. And God's People heard and understood.

Romans 8:8-17 "But if Christ is in you...the spirit is alive..."

For Paul, the world could be divided into two camps: those in the flesh and those in the Spirit. Those in the flesh lived a life of ignorance to God's will simply because they had not yet gained faith. But, those in the flesh could also be back-sliders or those with knowledge of the Christian life, who rejected the "Way." "In the flesh" meant all those who were not truly Christian.

Those in the Spirit, however, lived the Christian lifestyle. They worshiped together, shared fellowship with mutual affection, and reached out to non-believers. Not only did they think differently, they acted differently. Their faith led to charity. Their concern was for others, not for the self.

Paul may have painted the world in "black and white" terms, but his point is well taken. There is a difference between "it's all about me" and "it's all about others." That difference is the Spirit. When we live in sin, we focus on the self, and we slowly die. When we live in the Spirit, we focus on others – and on God – and we live. When we live in sin, we want it both ways. When we live in the Spirit, we only want what God wants.


Today's Psalm: 104

Lord send out your spirit, and renew the face of the earth.

John 14:15-16, 23b-26 "...the Holy Spirit...will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

In John's Gospel today, Jesus began with an "if . . . then . . . " statement that equated relationship with action. "If you love me, keep my commands." He then presented his followers with the reward that will come from God, "he will give you another Advocate to be with you always."

The mission of the Holy Spirit is to bring everyone to Christ. The Spirit prepares everyone and invites them to Christ. With the gift of Christ's risen life, the Spirit unites all believers to Christ and places them in communion with the Father.



In John, both the words and commands of Jesus showed the path to love. Love between the Father and the Son. Love between the Son and his followers. Now, Jesus told his disciples to follow his example. Love each other. The love relationship between the Father and the Son, between the Son and his followers, became the paradigm for life in the Christian community.
