



UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand what He says)

Proverbs 8:22-31

"The Lord possessed me, the beginning of his ways..."

The author of Proverbs wanted to raise the virtue of Wisdom to the highest of all virtues. Wisdom was part of God and had a place of honor in creation.

In these verses, the speaker, "wisdom", celebrated its priority in God's creation. First came "wisdom" before anything that was created. Then, as God created everything, his companion, "wisdom", delighted in the Lord's work. Finally, "wisdom" beckoned all to follow the Lord's ways.

Over the centuries, "wisdom" has been interpreted, as part of God's omniscient power. All we are, all we have in this world, was accomplished through God's wisdom as he created the universe.

Christians came to favor a more literal view. They

identified this person of wisdom with the Word (Jesus) or with the Spirit.

No matter how we interpret the author's meaning of "wisdom," there can be no doubt that today's passages were critical in the development of our Christian view of God as three persons.

Romans 5:1-5 "...the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit..."

What gifts were Christians given when they received salvation through Jesus Christ? According to Paul, we received grace and hope. Our faith gave us the "grace in which we stand" and "hope of the glory of God."

Along with these indisputable gifts, we were granted another, the (sometimes dubious) gift of our human afflictions. Paul's message is that our afflictions will, with work and understanding, assure us of the love of God. Our human condition requires endurance, which strengthens our character. Living through difficulties gives us hope, because we survive by and grow in the grace of God.

Now we've come full circle back to the hope our faith gives us through God's love and the Holy Spirit. Grace and hope...endurance and character...grace and hope. The circle of God's great love for us.

Today's Psalm: 8

O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth!

John 16:12-15

"...the Spirit of truth...will take from what is mine and declare it to you."

Sometimes we hide from the human truths in our lives. "Does this dress look good on me?" "Is my hair thinning?" "I can lose 5 lbs by Tuesday!" Hiding from or facing human truths are decisions for our human side.

Spiritual truth! What a gift it would be to know all the spiritual truth that God wants us to receive! The truth that we are promised through

the Holy Spirit. How will we obtain this truth?

In John's words today, Jesus tells us that the Spirit of truth will guide us to all truth. He will declare to us the things that are coming.

Jesus, the Word, came to our world. He was physically seen and heard. We still experience Christ in Word and Sacrament, in private prayer and in community. Through Christ, we experience the intimacy that the Father offers. In Christ, God is present to us.

When Christ was preparing to return to the Father, he promised that God would send us the Spirit, the Breath of God. In the Spirit, we are changed. In the Spirit, we are closer to God. Our experience of the Spirit might be radical and overwhelming, or it might be barely perceptible and easily overlooked. But that experience shifts us away from the self toward others and toward the Source.

This is the Christian experience of the Trinity of God: the Father, source of all things; Jesus the Word made flesh; the Spirit, the guide to all truth.
