

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

1 Kings 17:17-24 "See! Your son is alive."

In earlier verses, Elijah brought relief from drought and famine to a widow and her son. In today's reading, the son fell ill and passed away. The widow thought her son's death was a punishment for her guilt to which Elijah had brought attention. Elijah took the son and called out to God three times to bring the breath of life back into the child and the boy revived. This miracle led the woman to declare her faith once again, both in the God of Israel and in Elijah as his prophet.

The woman saw the miracle of her rescue from drought and famine, only to doubt God again when her son was taken from her. So often, we see miracles, but, like the widow, we forget so quickly.

We, too, see the hand of God in our daily lives, sometimes imperceptibly – as when we lay our hand on a book to read that happens to be just what we need to solve a problem; sometimes in very obvious ways - as when a loved one is rescued by our prayers.

God is always with us. We just need to listen and watch, so our declaration of faith will be the life we live every day.

Galatians 1:11-19

"...God...called me through his grace...that I might proclaim him to the Gentiles..."

Education matters. In the western world in the 21st



century, the higher the degree, the higher one's prestige. But, when it comes to faith, it might be better to ask a different question. That was certainly the case for St. Paul.

In today's reading, the apostle to the Gentiles gave a thumb-nail sketch of his conversion so that people would know that his message came from Christ himself. The startling method of Paul's conversion determined his ministry for the rest of his days. Before God struck Paul from his horse, he was a highly educated Jew, scrupulous in his duty to the Law and zealous in stamping out the new Christian movement. But in his encounter with the Risen Lord on the road to Damascus, he received a divine calling, a mission to preach salvation to the Gentiles. The revelation he received was so clear and deep. There was no need to consult with the eyewitness authorities, Peter and the bishop of Jerusalem. James. until he met with them three years later. Paul's authority came from Christ himself.

Paul's education as a Jew came from teachers handing knowledge down through history. How much more valuable was Paul's education that came from the source of all knowledge!

Today's Psalm: 30

I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me.


Luke 7:11-17 "God has visited his people"

This simple, poignant story is unique to Luke among the gospels. The incident echoed the ministries of two great prophets from Galilee: Elijah and Elisha. In today's reading from Kings, Elijah raised up the son of the widow from Zarephath. Later in Kings, Elisha raises the only son of a mother from Shunem. In both cases, the prophets knew the boys' mothers. In Luke, Jesus didn't know the mother, yet her tears moved him to pity.

The Old Testament prepared us for the coming of a Messiah who would save the world. When Jesus came, he performed miracles foreshadowed in the lives of prophets like Elijah and Elisha, both from Galilee, as Jesus was. These miracles of resurrection foretold the gift of salvation yet to come.

The tenderness of Jesus for the grieving widow reveals his love and compassion, not just for this one woman, but for all of us. The gift of the resurrection of the widow's son is a small insight into the great gift of salvation that Christ would give the world when he rose from the tomb on Easter morning.

When the people witness the raising of the widow's son, they knew, "God had visited his people." They knew then - and we know now - that God cares for each of us. He visits us and blesses us with his presence, like a father watches over his children. His presence reminds us to imitate his tenderness and compassion in our lives. When we treat others with kindness, we participate in raising them up. When they return to their lives feeling better for having met us, we follow the example of Christ's miracle of resurrection.
