UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

Deuteronomy 30:10-14

"...it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out"

Is it really so hard to understand what God wants from us?

This was the question Moses put before the people in Deuteronomy. The nature and ways of God might be mysterious. But his code of ethics and the worship that is his due were not. Both were clearly laid out before the people in the Law.

Despite God's promises and punishments, his people were a fickle lot. They feigned ignorance and human frailty when they disobeyed God's Law.

Moses reminded them that God had written the Law in their minds and in their hearts. If they would only look within themselves, they would return to God and obey his Law.

Thousands of years later, we are so much the same. We know the truth, but we sometimes reject it. With awareness of what God expects of us, comes obligation to obey his commandments. And so, we sometimes hide from God like his first children, Adam and Eve.

Moses knew. We don't need to search for God. Amid all the noise and calamity, all our daily obligations, God is with us.

Colossians 1:15-20

"Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation."

Paul's words today are said to be paraphrased from an early Christian hymn.

The most important part of this message is that Jesus Christ is the image of God himself. He is the instrument of God's creation and the presence of God is within him. Christ stood just below God in the hierarchy of the universe and was, therefore, above all things. All creation was within him, all in heaven and on earth.

By the power within him, Christ reconciled the world to himself, bringing peace and forgiveness to all by his death on the cross. All creation was reconciled to God by the firstborn of creation in his death and resurrection.

Such deep understanding of who Christ was so early in the Christian church is rather remarkable. When Paul was working so hard to spread the word of salvation, inspired understanding among the people was a great gift to his ministry.

Today's Psalm: 69

Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

Luke 10:25-37

"You shall love the Lord, your God...and your neighbor as yourself."

An educated scholar of the law challenged Jesus. He wanted to know how to follow the Law to attain salvation. The scribe was looking for that *act of faith* – the *one law* that would guarantee his place with God. "Love God" was the easy part. "Love your neighbor" was a lot harder to follow, or even to understand. Jewish Law required mercy among *Jews*. Gentiles, Samaritans, and followers of any non-Mosaic law were excluded.

Jesus knew that Jewish Law could be a stumbling block to the evangelization of his message. His seventy-two envoys had been sent on the mission of delivering the good news that all were invited to share in God's mercy. People who already considered themselves on the "inside" were not so happy to hear that *everyone* is invited into God's Kingdom.



Christ answered with a moral tale that challenged the scribe with a new understanding of 'neighbor'. The parable asked one question: What is more important, duty or mercy? This

question forced the scribe to acknowledge that the Samaritan, a man hated by the observant Jew, was truly a neighbor to the victim. The priest and the Levite, men who followed the letter of the law, refused to render themselves ritualistically 'unclean' by showing compassion to the injured man. In this case, the law made it impossible to obey God's commandment of love.

The parable emphasized the lesson that the evangelization of the Good News often takes the form of Christian service to our neighbors. When people see how we care for others, the Good News is spread without saying a word.

Everyone will know that you are my disciples when they see the love you have for one another.
