

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

Isaiah 66:18-21

"They shall bring all your brothers and sisters... to Jerusalem, my holy mountain..."

This week's reading continues the history of Jerusalem nearly a century after the Babylonian conquest.

Jerusalem was still mired in a struggle to rebuild God's temple and his holy city, but the people tired of the effort. Morale was low and the city remained only half built. To the citizens of Jerusalem, God must have seemed very distant indeed.




These passages shook the people from their despair. The Lord spoke to his people and assured them that Jerusalem's glory would return because the city stood as a sign of God's glory. He

would send messengers to nations who had never heard his word and they would come to Jerusalem to seek and worship God. The brothers and sisters of the Israelites would join the chosen, already in Jerusalem, to proclaim God's glory.

God's plan for *his* people was for *all* people who heard his word and came to worship. As we tire and lose sight of God in our busy lives, today's reading reminds us that salvation awaits everyone who trusts in God's plan.

Hebrews12:5-7, 11-13 "...whom the Lord loves, he disciplines..."

The author of Hebrews encourages us, in our struggle for spiritual growth, to look to God as a child looks to a parent. When we stray from doing what is right, we are sure to experience discipline



from God, as we would from a loving parent.

There are lessons in God's discipline. When we suffer the consequences of turning away from him, we are shaken awake to our responsibility as Christians to "make straight paths", trust in God, and follow his ways.

Human suffering is not always a punishment from God. Sometimes we witness grief that seems undeserved. We ask, "Why me, God?" or "Why this little child?" Some suffering is just a part of our imperfect humanity. Yet, we can learn lessons from this pain as well. We learn that God's creatures are made to survive and be stronger for their suffering. It draws us to faith, to prayer, to one another and, ultimately, to God.

Today's Psalm: 117

Go out to all the world and tell the Good News/

Luke 13:22-30

"Lord, will only a few people be saved?"

In today's gospel, Jesus admonished the chosen people to "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." He reminded the Jewish people that now, *everyone* had been invited to enter the kingdom of heaven. The Jews had once been the only people invited to the feast and they believed, if they followed all the proper practices – were good Jews – they would be "saved". Now, how were they to seek God's favor and find a place at his feast?

Jesus used the image of party crashers who took for granted that they would be admitted by the gatekeeper because they had shared meals with the master and had followed him around in his travels. But these were people who did not truly *know* God. They went through the motions of religious observance, but did not truly devote themselves to God. Jesus warned that they would be strangers to him when they sought entrance into his heavenly kingdom.

This gospel highlights the gift of Christ's death and resurrection – the gift of salvation – offered to Jews and Gentiles alike. The answer to the question in today's Gospel is that salvation is for everyone, whether the first to be invited or the very last. But there is work to be done – trusting in God and following his ways – in order, finally, to earn a seat at the table.
