#### **UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS**

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14 "So the Lord relented..."

God was really angry at the Israelites in today's reading. What had they done that he was ready to destroy them and create a new covenant with Moses to replace the one he had made with Abraham and his descendants?


Earlier in Exodus, the orders of worship were declared in great detail - the altar, vessels, garments, method of sacrifice. God had clearly told his people what he wanted. Now they ignored his words by trying to put a face on God and worshipping – not God – but a man-made image. God had taken the Israelites as his people, promising the gifts of a great heritage, a land of plenty and his eternal commitment to them. They should have understood they did not need a graven image to augment their intimate relationship with God.

Moses begged God to keep the covenant he had established with Abraham. And God relented and allowed Moses' faith to earn forgiveness for all his people.

Moses pled before God for his people and God embraced them. God's forgiveness is always available when we offer repentance.

# 1 Timothy 1:12-17 "Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners."

Today's message of God's mercy continues in the letter to Timothy. Biblical scholars have challenged whether this letter was actually written by Paul, but the authorship is not nearly as important as the message of forgiveness and mercy.



Paul's conversion saved him from a life of arrogant denial of Christ. The faith and love of Jesus Christ and the grace of God were abundantly bestowed on him to save him and give him faith. He was mercifully treated in his ignorance and was shown the

patience and love that Christ showed the world when he came to save us.

This brief review of Paul's life gives us hope. Despite our sinfulness, God still loves us. He gives us courage and strength, love and hope. He pours his grace and mercy upon us in overflowing measure. His forgiveness is always available to us.

# Today's Psalm: 51


I will rise and go to my father.

#### Luke 15:1-32 or 15: 1-10

"...there will be rejoicing among the angels over one sinner who repents."

The Pharisees are again trying to shame Jesus by challenging whether he followed Jewish law properly. They knew he shared meals with "sinners", thereby breaking Jewish laws. If his companions were not "holy", then *his* holiness was contaminated. Why did he not separate himself from unworthy people?

Jesus used the parables of the "lost" to show the Pharisees that God will welcome everyone back into his presence, though they had been lost to him through sin. Just as a shepherd rejoices when he finds one of his hundred sheep and the woman is overjoyed to find a coin she had lost, Jesus tells the Pharisees that there will be so much more rejoicing in heaven when a sinner repents and returns to God.



The familiar story of the prodigal son is one that is familiar and easy to understand because it is so human. Even after the son threw away his gifts and turned away from his family, his father loved him every bit as much upon his return as he loved him the day he left. If a human father can love so well, how much deeper is the love that God has for us?

Some of us may need a little less forgiveness than the Prodigal Son, but it is a great comfort to know that big sins and little sins will be set aside when we return to God and ask for the abundant forgiveness and mercy that is always available to us.
