UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)


Amos 8:4-7

"The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: Never will I forget a thing they have done!"

Long ago, a 6th grade math teacher said, "When you put a dollar sign in front of a number, your math improves." Yet, sometimes a dollar sign can obscure the true value of our riches.

Today's reading highlights the very human error of allowing possessions to rule us, rather than using them according to God will.

Prosperity brings privilege as well as responsibility. Wealth's privilege affords freedom from material want, but also carries the obligation to assist others in need. God wants us to enjoy our material gifts and asks only that we use them fairly and wisely, and with compassion for people in our lives.



Wealth is not always preceded by a dollar sign. Sometimes our riches are simply the treasure of a loving family, healthy children, a beloved spouse, a secure home. These are treasures that free us to share ourselves with others, with a kind word, a friendly smile, or a few minutes of our time.

If we hold God's words in our hearts, we will always remember to care for others. "Never will I forget a thing that they have done!"

1 Timothy 2:1-8

"It is my wish...men should pray, lifting up holy hands, without anger or argument."

The desire for a peaceful life is almost universal.

Today's reading describes an ideal Christian life, encouraging Christians to pray for their nations and their leaders. Through prayer, Christ, our savior, would mediate with his Father on our behalf and God would bless his faithful with a tranquil life.

The author of today's reading affirms the ministry of Paul as herald, apostle, and teacher of faith and truth to the Gentiles. Then he closes as he began – with an appeal for prayer. This second call to prayer asks men to pray with holy hands and without anger.

This reading is especially important in the world today. We are called to pray in a way that is pleasing to God, asking for peace and dignity, seeking knowledge of truth. As we pray for these gifts for ourselves, we may ask the same for all of God's people.

Today's Psalm: 11

Praise the Lord, praise the Lord who lifts up the poor.

Luke 16:10-13

"The person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones."

Christ's parables are meant to teach us lessons that will be useful to us in following God, but they are not always easy to understand.

Today's parable is about trustworthiness. In life, in our careers, we start with small responsibilities and, as we prove ourselves, we are trusted with greater ones. Each time we show that we can be trusted with a task, others are encouraged to rely on us in greater and greater measure. It feels good to know that people look to us when they have a job to do.

Christ compares our service in the world with our service to God. We are called to serve masters in this world, our teachers, our parents, our supervisors. But, more importantly, we must serve the Master of our souls, with greater constancy than we serve the masters of this world.

We need to serve in our human world, but we cannot divide our souls between God and worldly gain.

The Un-doer of Knots

Mary is the Mother who patiently and lovingly brings us to God, so that he can untangle the knots of our soul by his fatherly mercy. We all have some of these knots and we can ask in our heart of hearts:

What are the knots in my life? "Father, my knots cannot be undone!" It is a mistake to say anything of the sort! All the knots of our heart, every knot of our conscience, can be undone. Do I ask Mary to help me trust in God's mercy, to undo those knots, to change? She, as a woman of faith, will surely tell you: "Get up, go to the Lord: he understands you."
