The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

This Sacrament is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, especially near the time of death. Sacraments are outward signs established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace. The Anointing is a rite performed to bestow God's grace on the recipient through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The special grace of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

- unites the sick person to the passion of Christ
- brings strength, peace, and courage to endure in a Christian manner the sufferings of illness or old
- bestows the forgiveness of sins if the sick person was not able to obtain it through the sacrament of penance
- can provide restoration of health if it is conducive to the salvation of his soul
- prepares the faithful for passing over to eternal life

We do not have to be at the point of death to receive this sacrament.

The Catechism says that the anointing of the sick is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death. As soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, it is certainly a fitting time for a Catholic to receive this sacrament.

Any parishioner in need of anointing is invited to call the rectory to make arrangements.



UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

"God is a Father

who forgives. His

mercy is greater

than our sin."

—Mother Teresa

Wisdom 11:22 - 12:2

"you...love all things that are and loathe nothing that you have made..."

Today's reading presents God as the Master who watches over all he has created. All creation is loved because God did not create anything that is unworthy of his divine love.

Because of his love, God can chastise his creatures, whose free will enables them sometimes to turn away from him. In his love, he treats our sins with patience. We can turn to him in repentance and we will be embraced equally with all his creatures.

The book of Wisdom gives us hope by reminding us that God will never reject us. He created us. He loves us. God has reserved for each of us a place of honor his kingdom if we return to him and ask forgiveness.

2 Thessalonians 1:11 - 2:2 "We always pray for you that God may make you worthy..."

Paul is once again reminding us that God is calling us to glory and that salvation has been bestowed upon us by Christ's death and resurrection. It must have been nice for the early Christians to know that Paul was always praying for them, for their worthiness before God, so that Christ would live glorified in them.

Paul also calms the new followers of Christ and tells them not to become alarmed with thoughts that "the day of the Lord is at hand."

So, what is the message in today's reading? Prepare your soul for the future!...or...Don't worry about the future! And was it even Paul who wrote this letter...or perhaps a second-century Christian many years after Paul's death.

It seems much more important to hear the words than to know who wrote them...the message that fulfilling our faith and goodness will make us worthy of God's grace and, if we are worthy, we will be ready whenever "the day of the Lord" comes.

Today's Psalm: 145

I will praise your name forever, my king and my God

Luke 19:1-10

"For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

The story of Zacchaeus is one of the most beloved and understandable passages in Luke. It presents a comical image of a grown man climbing a tree because he was too small to see what was happening among the crowds

that surrounded Jesus. The childish image is contrasted with Zacchaeus' status in his community. He was tax collector. He was considered a traitor by his own people and a convenient tool by the Romans.

Why does this wealthy tax collector want to see Jesus? We can only surmise that a man reviled by his community wanted to see Jesus simply because the traveling preacher

represented a chance. And a change. Like the other unclean and questionable characters in Luke, Zacchaeus was fertile ground for redemption, for turning his life around and trusting in God again.

Jesus saw beyond the reticence of the crowd and the bravado of the tax man and peered into the man's heart. Yes, this all-too-human, lost soul had great value and was worthy of the Kingdom – as much as were any of the skeptics in the crowd.

The little man stood tall and became a follower, proving that Jesus was Lord and belief in him would lead to eternal life.

When we feel we've lost our way, the story of Zacchaeus reminds us that that Jesus can see into our hearts and that salvation is ours for the asking.

And we don't even need to climb a tree.
