

UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

2 Samuel 5:1-3

"You shall shepherd my people Israel..."

Today's reading portrays David as the ideal king, the one to which every other king would be compared.

These few passages mark the beginning of David's reign. Representatives from all the Israelite tribe gather at the coronation to pledge their allegiance to David. At the same time, David and the tribes dedicate themselves once again to the Lord.

David enjoyed a glorious reign. He was a hero in battle who united his people and he was chosen by God to "shepherd my people...and be commander of Israel."

Jesus was born of the House and Lineage of David, but the kingdom of Jesus is not in this world. David foreshadowed the Messiah who would come in the person of Jesus Christ and David's earthly kingdom foretold the one that Christ would establish, the Kingdom of God, not in this world, but in the eternal world beyond death.

Colossians 1:12-20 "Let us give thanks to the Father...He delivered us from the power of darkness..."

In this week of Thanksgiving, the letter to the Colossians encourages us to give thanks that we have been delivered from darkness and have been redeemed and absolved of our sins through the Son of God.

This letter may not have been written by Paul himself, but it repeats the lesson that Paul passed on to the new Christians over and over again...that we have received salvation through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This reading praises Christ as the one, both human and divine, who reconciles us with God, our Father.

The author of today's verses inspires Christians to give thanks ("eucharisteo" in Greek). The Eucharist is offered to us at every Mass, reminding us that we can give thanks every day for the gift of salvation that we received through Christ's resurrection. Our deliverance from darkness into light can be acknowledged at every celebration of the Eucharist.

Today's Psalm: 122

Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Luke 23:35-43

"Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Today's Gospel begins with Jesus in his final humiliation as a man. Most of his followers had deserted him. His possessions had been gambled away. To all appearances, he would die in disgrace between two thieves.

Christ suffered to the end, taunted and mocked as a royal pretender, the "King of the Jews."

The men who were crucified with Christ were a study in humanity, our good side and our bad side. The unrepentant thief derided Jesus along with his tormentors, finishing his own life in an attitude devoid of compassion or pity. In his own last few moments of life, he condemned Christ, as if to drag him into the same darkness he had chosen for himself.

The "good" thief was the better side of our human nature, the part of us that takes pity on the suffering of others. The thief had resigned himself to death and acknowledged that he deserved his fate. With a tiny grain of faith, he sought mercy from the innocent Christ – that Jesus would remember him in his Kingdom.

Jesus rewarded the "good" thief with a gift even greater than forgiveness of his sins. He gave him eternal life – without delay, on that day, at that moment. As the thief reached out in faith, he received complete assurance that he would live with the Lord in paradise.
