(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

Today's Psalm: 72

Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

Isiaah 11:1-10

"There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain..."

When Isaiah wrote today's reading, Judea lived in fear of their Assyrian conquerors. His people needed a message of hope. Isaiah encouraged them with a promise of better times under the rule of a great king...a Messiah!



The great king would be of the house David. He would be faithful to the Law and judge fairly. Under him, God, humanity and nature would live in a time of peace.

Isaiah prophesied the ideal Jewish king, the righteous ruler who possessed the wisdom and power of God's Spirit.

Romans 15:4-9

"Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you..."

As we await the birth of Jesus during Advent, Paul reminds us of the gift of hope given to us in Scripture...that through the words of Scripture, God instructs us to endure. Paul encourages us to think in harmony with one another, as Jesus Christ taught his followers, so that we may glorify God with one voice.

"Welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you." In Christ, the promises of Scripture were confirmed, not just for his own people, but for the Gentiles as well.

Very soon, we will celebrate the birth of Christ, welcoming him once again into our lives, together with all his followers across the world.

Matthew 3:1-12

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths."

Centuries of Scripture foretold a Messiah. Today's Gospel introduces a contemporary of Christ, his cousin, in fact, who readied the people for the Messiah who was already in the world. There was no more time to anticipate his arrival. The Messiah was among them.

John's message was a shocking wake-up call to a



conservative culture. It was one thing to know the Messiah was coming "someday." It was another to be told that there was no more time to waste...to demand a personal moral change

for an imminent event. John preached an immediate spiritual return to God.

The leaders of the Jews bristled under this message of urgency. John was challenging their ways of 'waiting' by insisting upon true moral change and demanding proof of it. He dipped people in water, symbolically separating them from their old lives and baptizing them into a new life.

John saw his role as minor, for One greater would come to baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire, who would be God's instrument of judgement.

The Season of Advent is our time to prepare once again for the Messiah. Even though we celebrate every year, we are always a little unprepared for the day. John alerted the people centuries ago and his words alert us today.
