UNDERSTANDING TODAY'S READINGS

(In order to understand God's love, we need to understand and ponder what He says)

Today's Psalm: 146

Lord, come and save us.

Isiaah 35:1-6, 10

"Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the death be cleared...the tongue of the dumb will sing."

Isaiah's words assume a dire state of affairs for the world as it awaits the saving touch of God. When God arrives, the barren wilderness will rejoice in springtime bloom; desolation will be



replaced with splendor; the frightened will be reassured; the weak will be made strong; the blind will see; the deaf will hear; still tongues will sing.

Isaiah looks forward to the day when God ransoms us from our imprisonment and we enter his kingdom with joy, to live in his presence forever.

Isaiah's words focused on the future coming of the Lord. The season Advent is our time to anticipate the joyful celebration of the birth of Christ.

James 5:7-10

"Be patient, brothers and sisters...Do not complain..."

James wove his definition of faith and works together in these few verses. He counseled patience as we wait for the Lord's return.

James realized that, as the Christian community waited, the feeling of anticipation began to wear thin. They had fallen into the all-too-human habits of gossip, unkindness, and finding fault with each other. He cautioned them to stop complaining and judging one another. The Judge of all is waiting. The day of God's return has been promised, but we still do not know when it will be.

Therefore, James offered examples of patience: a



farmer who waits for his crop; the prophets who waited for centuries for God to return. Our wait for the Lord's coming should be met with the same patience and firm heart.

Matthew 11:2-11

"Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you."

Many scholars believe that, before Jesus began his own ministry, he was a disciple of John the Baptist. Both preached the message, "Repent! The Kingdom of God is at hand." When John was arrested, Jesus' began to gather his disciples and to deliver the Good News to all the people.

Jesus answered John's question, "Are you the one...?" by telling his messengers to tell John what Jesus was doing – how Jesus addressed himself to the sufferings of the poor, bringing sight to the blind, hearing to deaf ears, walking to the lame, cleansing to lepers, even raising the dead to life.

The ministry of Jesus in the world was the one foretold by Isaiah and other prophets and finally, by John, Christ's contemporary. John prepared the people for the Kingdom. As the Messiah, Christ was the Kingdom here on earth.

Until Christ, there was no one born of woman greater than John the Baptist, who made straight the path for the Messiah. When Christ came into the world, our Messiah was here to give us a path to his kingdom.
