Fr. Jim's Words of Wisdom

Life isn't fair. It's the issue that the Gospel offers us. Jesus tells the familiar parable of the landowner who hires workers at different times of the day and pays them exactly the same amount even though some have worked longer than others. Those who have worked longer complain about it to the owner, telling him it's unjust, it's not fair. And the owner tells them it's none of their business--they got the money they were promised, that's all that matters.

OK, so life isn't fair. What should we do about it? One of my former students at Fairfield University showed me. His arrival at my dormitory door was a little complicated. To get his wheelchair into the room we had to move some things that were in the way. "No worries," he said, the familiar big smile beaming on his face. All his life, growing up in the hills of Pennsylvania he was like a pup—running free, climbing up hills, leaping for balls, yelping joyfully in play.

A couple of years ago on a cross country run his legs gave out and he fell in a heap, and when the medics came to check him out the only thing he could feel was the warmth of the sun upon his face. "The sun felt so good," he told me. "Even though I couldn't feel the rest of my body, at that moment, I was really grateful for the sun." Two years later, he had regained some feeling in his upper body, and he had some use of his hands, but below his waist he was numb. That was going to be the extent of his recovery for the rest of his life.

He got one of those electric wheelchairs, and he became pretty good at maneuvering it around in tight spaces like my office. But you should have seen this kid, all 19 years of him, his face glowing from some inner fuel. I wish you could have heard his gratitude for what he did have and for what he could do.

"I'm not exactly sure what I'm going to do with the rest of my life," he told me, "but I want to help other people like I have been helped. I've got to pass it on." I sat there across from him in his wheelchair and marveled at this kid---a smiling Christopher Reeves in the flesh before me---thinking of course, about how small and complaining and ungenerous and ungrateful I can often be.

You now what? Gratitude unlocks the fullness of life. It turns what we have into enough...and more. It turns denial into acceptance, chaos to order, confusion to clarity. It can turn a meal into a feast, a house into a home, a stranger into a friend. Gratitude makes sense of our past, brings peace for today, and creates a vision for tomorrow.

Life isn't fair. But I know One who is fair—and He can be trusted.
