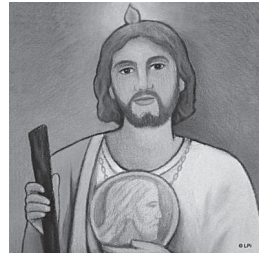
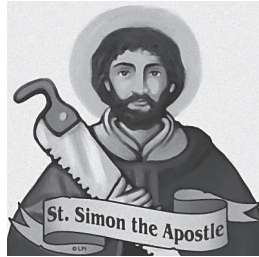

Church of the Epiphany - Church Etiquette

For Catholics, the Mass is a solemn and sacred event in which we are renewed in our faith by our encounter with the Real Presence of Jesus Christ. In the Mass, we grow together with the universal church. During this sacred time of prayer, we must keep in mind:

Be thoughtful. Be silent. Be reverent. This is the house of the LORD. Before Mass begins, speak to God. During Mass, let God speak to you. After Mass, speak with one another. The church is a house of prayer. Please refrain from personal conversations in church.

Cell phones and other **electronic devices** should be turned off when entering church.

Arrive before Mass begins.

It is disrespectful to arrive after Mass has begun.

Observe the Eucharistic fast.

Do not chew gum or any eat other food in church, especially when planning to receive the Eucharist. The fast should be observed for no less than one hour before receiving the Eucharist.

Observe an appropriate dress code.

Dressing modestly and respectfully at Mass shows that we recognize the privilege of an invitation to the table of the Lord. We dress for the occasion.

Do not bring food or drink into the church. At Mass, food and drink are received only at the sacred moment of Holy Communion.

Children are always welcome as an active part of our parish community. Many parents find it helpful to move to the narthex when their children become restless during the Mass.

Do not leave before Mass ends. Stay for the final blessing. Leaving Mass directly after Communion would be the equivalent of finishing dinner at a friend's home and immediately rising from the table, grabbing your coat and walking out the door. God is entitled to reverence at all times, but most of all when we are invited to celebrate the sacrifice of his Son in the Mass.
