The Deeper Side of Lent

Lent is an important season in the Church calendar.



But it's not the *most* important. If you're a baseball fan, think of Lent as more like spring training than the World Series. That's because Lent is the time to get ready for something, to prepare – just like spring training prepares the team for opening day of the regular season. Lent looks forward to Easter, the fifty-day celebration of the Lord's resurrection. To have a "great Lent" but a "lousy Easter" is not the way to go.

A lot of people think that Lent is a time for *giving up* something. That's only half true. It's better to think of Lent as a time for

opening up. We want to open up our hearts to receive God's grace, which ultimately is the grace of the Holy Spirit that the risen Lord sends to us – which we especially celebrate at Easter. So the real question to ask ourselves if we want to have a good Lent is: How do I open up my heart to receive the Lord's grace? That's the deeper side of Lent.

Opening up your heart might well mean that you have to empty yourself of a lot of clutter that is blocking the Lord's grace. That's where the "giving up" idea of Lent makes a lot of sense. If you are attached in the wrong way to something that holds you back from being a true disciple, Lent is a good time to work to jettison it from your life. But the point is not to make Lent into a test of your will power, as if opening our hearts to grace were all our doing. "I want to prove that I can give up chocolate for 40 days," does not capture the essence of the gospel message. The point is there is something that gets in the way of God's grace working in your life, so you want to remove the obstacle. Removing obstacles can lead to a profound conversion in one's life, if you really do it in a serious way that touches something deep in your life.

But opening your heart to God's grace is not just about emptying out, cleaning house so to speak. It's also about filling your life with good things that bring you closer to the Lord. The best way to do that is first of all to devote some time and energy to prayer. Prayer, of course, is supposed to fill our lives all the time. But during Lent we can give that truth a little more concentrated attention. Prayer can take many forms. Daily mass is an obvious place to start. We can also set aside a particular time of day – morning or evening – for private reflection or vocal prayer, like the rosary, or reading scripture. How about taking one of the gospels and reading a passage each morning? A great way to start the day!

But the positive side of Lent is not just about our devotional practices. Think of baseball players again. Each of them approaches spring training with a particular goal in mind. One player works on improving his hitting, or his fielding, or losing weight. I think that's a good tactic for us as we approach Lent. What is your particular goal? Assess your weaknesses, but also your strengths. Can you be more caring for a spouse, or more patient with a child, or more responsible with the way you spend money? How will that free you from obstacles so that the Lord's tender love can hold you closer to himself? And how will it help you share God's grace with others, especially your loved ones? These are the kinds of actions that reflect new life in our hearts, so that we can come to Easter experiencing in a new way that the Lord is truly risen. With this kind of Lent behind you, you'll be really ready for a truly Happy Easter!
