### TO RENEW OUR CHURCH

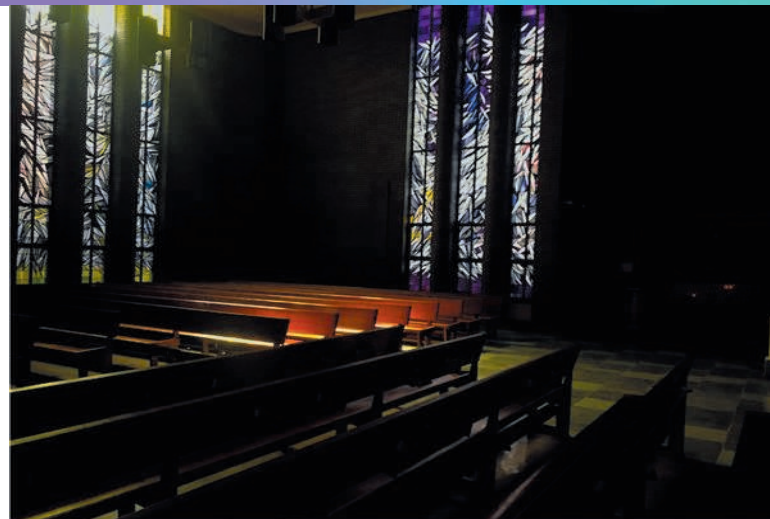
The Gallop Organization reports that weekly church attendance has declined among U.S. Catholics in the past decade, while it has remained steady among Protestants. From 2014 to 2017, an average of 39% of Catholics reported attending church in the past seven days. This is down from an average of 45% from 2005 to 2008 and represents a steep decline from 75% in 1955.

By contrast, the 45% of Protestants who reported attending church weekly from 2014 to 2017 is essentially unchanged from a decade ago and is largely consistent with the long-term trend.

After stabilizing in the mid-2000s, weekly church attendance among U.S. Catholics has resumed its downward trajectory over the past decade. In particular, older Catholics have become less likely to report attending church in the past seven days -- so that now, for the first time, a majority of Catholics in no generational group attend weekly. Further, given that young Catholics are even less devout, it appears the decline in church attendance will only continue.

As you may have noted, our wonderful Church of the Epiphany has been similarly affected. We publish our church capacity percentages each week, and most Masses average below 30% of the building's capacity.

For some, that can be a depressing statistic. But for all of us, it can be a challenging invitation. We shouldn't lose hope. As Chris Lowney, author of *Everyone Leads, How to Revitalize the Catholic Church*, suggests, we at Epiphany can all join in the task. **Like the mustard seed**, we can build the Church of the Epiphany into a place that overflows with new parishioners seeking a welcoming home, and a community that reaches out with love to our community and the broken world. To revitalize our Church, we can consider these elements of the early church:

4. **BALANCING CHANGE AND CONTINUITY.** Like the early Christians, we at Epiphany should find creative ways to share the rich tradition of the Church and find new ways to express our faith to a contemporary world.

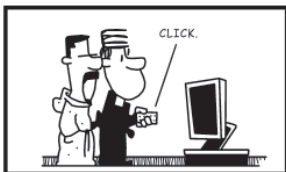

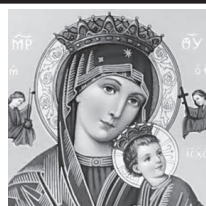
