#### Pastor's Corner Fifth Sunday of Easter 18 May 2025

<u>Love</u>. Most of Jesus Christ's teachings center upon one theme – one word – <u>Love</u> – (<u>Agape love</u> specifically). Love is needed to spread God's teachings throughout the world. God's commandment to love one another the way that He loves us is paramount! In this way God's kingdom of justice, peace and love will spread throughout our world! We are His witnesses who have been commanded to share this message with everyone whom we meet.

According to the Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, "Jesus tells His Apostles that <u>all</u> will know they are <u>His</u> disciples if they love one another. We are called to follow this command to love, so that God can use <u>us</u> to draw the world to Himself. This is what Paul and Barnabas are endeavoring to do in the first reading; they are proclaiming the Gospel out of love for God and His people so that the reign of His love might spread throughout the [whole] world." [1]

As we know, <u>charity</u> is another word for **love**. Therefore, Christian charity is Christian love – Love of God, Love of self, and Love of neighbor! Plain and simple! **The Decalogue** – <u>The Ten Commandments</u> were whittled down to the two <u>Great Commandments</u>: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself." (1 John 4:7) [2] Then, on Ascension Day, Jesus whittled the two Great Commandments down to the <u>New Commandment</u>: "A <u>New Commandment</u> I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35) [3]

<u>Love</u> – <u>Agape Love</u> – <u>self-giving</u>, <u>self-sacrificing love</u>! <u>Selfless</u> love solely for another person, <u>not selfish love</u> only for oneself! <u>God is love!</u> How many times have we heard this statement? <u>Never</u> have we heard that God is not love. <u>Never</u> have we heard that God is the seven deadly sins! All sin comes from a lack of love. A lack of love of God, oneself, or one's neighbor!

Why is it that so many books, songs, television programs and movies focus in on love as a main theme? Could it be that true love is very hard to find, and then, once found, to hold on to? We must focus on true love – agape love – not eros (lust). Lust is selfish and self-serving, not caring about the well-being of the other person involved. Eros focuses solely upon gratification – the gratification of one's own desires without caring at all about the well-being of the other – even oftentimes being hurtful to the other person. That is not true love. That is not love at all. Rather, it is lust.

<u>Agape</u> is the love that Jesus teaches. <u>Agape</u> is the love that <u>God Is!</u> This is the type of love that all of Christ's disciples <u>are called</u> to emulate! How can we say that we <u>love</u> God, whom we <u>cannot</u> see with bodily eyes [in the Flesh], when we hate our brother and our sister whom we <u>can</u> see with bodily eyes? <u>That is being phony</u>, <u>false</u>, <u>hypocritical!</u>

According to the Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, "<u>Jesus wants us to love as He loves</u>. Our faithfulness and attentiveness to right and wrong, to holiness, and to the practice of our faith is important. <u>Yet Jesus furthers our understanding of following Him by making [crystal] clear the greatest commandment of every disciple: to love as He loves!" [4]</u>

<u>Plain and simple</u>. Most of Jesus Christ's teachings center upon one theme – one word – <u>Love</u> – (<u>Agape love</u> specifically). As we know, <u>charity</u> is another word for love. Therefore, Christian charity is Christian love – Love of God, Love of self, and Love of neighbor! Plain and simple! Therefore, what excuse do we have when we do not love as God loves? What excuse do we have when we fail to follow the New Commandment that Jesus Christ Himself taught and emulated by His examples while He was amongst us in the Flesh? None! No excuse! We cannot say that we have not been taught this over and over again! If we do say that we have not been taught this, that would be a world-class "whopper" of a falsehood! Be well and God bless you all in the love of God!






