Pastor's Corner

Solemnity of Sts. Peter & Paul, Apostles - 29 June 2025

Jesus asked this question of His disciples: “But who do you say that I am?” [1] “Simon Peter replied, ‘You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.’ And Jesus answered him, ‘Blessed are you Simon Bar Jona! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but My Father who is in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the powers of death shall not prevail against it.’” [2] (Matthew 16:15-18) “I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.” (Matthew 16:19) [3] And thus, the image of the crossed keys on the papal coat of arms.

According to the Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, “While preaching and spreading the Gospel after the Resurrection, Peter was arrested by King Herod. Meanwhile, *prayer by the Church was fervently being made to God on his behalf*. The early Church offers us an example of intercessory prayer that we should imitate by praying fervently for the successor of Peter, the pope” [4] – Pope Leo XIV.

According to Javier Soegaard in the *Loose-Leaf Lectionary for Mass*, “Today we might picture ourselves on the streets of Jerusalem, Antioch, or many cities traversed by [Sts.] Peter and Paul. Perhaps we are the recipients of funny looks as we gawk at the sights. In among this feast for the senses, we notice a mix of fear and excitement as new believers flock to our message of resurrection and salvation while others threaten with hostility. In these places, the mission Christ has given us is enormous. We have to spread the Gospel in a vast and diverse empire. We have to establish communities of believers, nurture faith, and keep those communities connected to one another. We have to help people understand the beauty of the mission that Jesus has given them in spite of their weaknesses. We might also imagine ourselves questioned, prodded, and imprisoned like Peter and Paul. Perhaps we can even place ourselves in the prison with Peter, feeling God’s strength and care as chains fall from our wrists and the angel of the Lord leads us into freedom.” [5]

“*Our task today as a church has changed very little*. We are called to those same ministries of healing, nurturing, proclamation, and community building – and to do these things whether the public sphere accepts us or decries us. In addition, we have the tremendous task of doing all this in spite of our imperfections, conscientious of our own constant need for conversion and healing, but also aware that God’s grace continues to strengthen us.” [6]

“In his letters, Paul acknowledges his former ways, writing, ‘For you heard of my former way of life in Judaism, how I persecuted the Church of God beyond measure’ (Gal 1:11-20, Vigil). But Paul also celebrates the new life and the mission he has been given in Christ, that through him ‘the proclamation might be completed and all the Gentiles might hear it,’ and that the Lord stands by him to give him strength to compete well, finish the race, and keep the faith (2 Tim 4:6-8, 17-18, Mass during the day).” [7]

Enzo Lodi in his book entitled, *Saints of the Roman Calendar*, “According to ancient tradition, Simon, whose name changed to Peter (meaning rock), died by crucifixion with his head near the ground, as was the Roman custom for the crucifixion of slaves. Recent excavations confirm that the martyrdom of St. Peter, around the year 67 [AD], took place on the Vatican Hill, where the basilica of Constantine was constructed.” [8]

“Paul of Tarsus, whose name was originally Saul, was a Pharisee and a persecutor of Christians. He converted to Christianity after his extraordinary experience on the road to Damascus (Acts 9:1-19). After his second imprisonment at Rome, he was beheaded (around the year 67 [AD], according to Tertullian) not far from the basilica that was given to the care of monks in the sixth century.” [9]

Thanks be to God that we do not have to face crucifixion or being beheaded because of our faith in the United States. However, we have the same role to play as St. Peter (to the Hebrews) and St. Paul (to the Gentiles). That role is to spread the Good News of the Gospel throughout the world so that all will come to know and realize just how loved they are by God Himself! We need to spread this message as widely as humanly possible! It just may bring others to the faith! Be well and may God bless you and your family abundantly!
