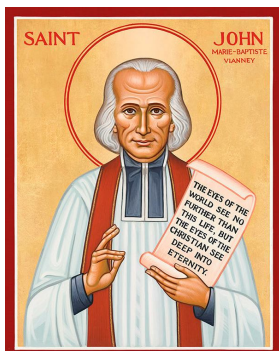
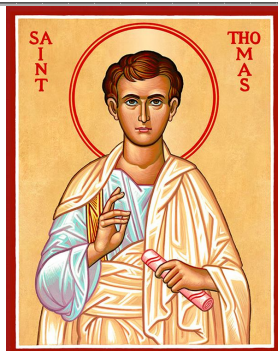

St. Jean-Marie Baptiste Vianney – died 4 August 1859 – at the age of 73. He is universally known as the “Curé of Ars”. He was a compassionate spiritual counselor who spent usually no less than eleven hours every day in the confessional in the winter, and sixteen hours daily in the summer. [1] Penitents came from all over to have their confessions heard and to receive his wise counsel. He is the patron saint of priests and the parish clergy.

Pastor's Corner

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

3 August 2025

"Do not allow earthly pursuits to delay building a life of discipleship [to God]." [1]

According to the Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, "Much of life is spent in toil, working to earn what we need to support ourselves and our families.

Though this pursuit is ***necessary and good***, the Lord reminds us not to fall into the trap of allowing work to become the sole foundation of our lives. Particularly not to the extent that it leads us to forgo or delay building a life of discipleship [to God]." [2]

You cannot take it with you! Instead, focus upon the things of heaven – things that are above – not upon the things of earth. Job said it so well: "Naked I came from my mother's womb, and naked shall I return; the Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job 1:21) [3] Even though Job lost everything, he remained faithful to God. He never blamed God because of his misfortune! Because of Job's faithfulness and perseverance, he regained all that he had lost, plus much more in addition!

I have never seen a moving van included in a funeral procession. Obviously, we need possessions in order to live in this life. That statement is a given. However, we allow possessions to consume or preoccupy us. If that happens, they become false idols pulling us away from discipleship with God. Our ***ultimate*** focus must be on the Triune God! The message of the Sacred Scripture readings for today is very clear: store up treasures for oneself in ***heaven, not on earth!*** Why not? The possessions that we have while on earth are transitory. They will eventually belong to someone else once our time on earth is done. ***Instead***, store up treasures for yourself in ***heaven*** – treasures that will endure forever! ***Treasures that you will take with you as you leave this world.*** Namely, good deeds! Good actions that prove that we are true Christians by our compassion for others. This is precisely what matters to God! God never forgets the good deeds that we do during our lifetime! They indeed go with us as we depart this life to meet the Lord.

Therefore, we are to seek what is eternal. All things are indeed vanity if our focus is not on God. If our focus is not on the things of heaven, what good is all our toil in this life? Yes, we will leave an inheritance to our family. However, what will be our legacy? Whose life did we make better while we were living? How many souls did we lead to Christ? What difference did we make in our world because we lived in it for a time? How did we make the world a better place? Will it be clear that we were Christians by our works? Will it be just as clear that we were Christians by our loving care of others and their loving memory of us once we are no longer living?

"But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith." (James 2:18) [4] "For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven." (Matthew 5:20) [5]

Let us all heed the clear message of today's Sacred Scripture readings and focus our attention on the things that are eternal – things that endure! I pray that this focus on God will profit each of us for everlasting life! Be well, and may God bless you and your families abundantly!
