





Pastor's Corner Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time 24 August 2025

God offers salvation to everyone in and through His Only-Begotten Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. [1] According to the Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by Faith Catholic, "God's desire is that we **love Him** and **serve Him** and are **united** *to* Him for [all] eternity." [2]

"We are called by baptism to the salvation that He offers through His Son. **What matters is** <u>our response</u> to that loving and life-giving invitation: **how we live** out our lives as **faithful** disciples makes the ultimate difference. It is <u>our witness</u> that will encourage others to hear and respond to God's call to them." [3]

We need the Sacraments to provide us with God's grace and strength to "run the race" of this life towards a completion that is pleasing in the sight of Almighty God. The "race" of our life here on earth is not a sprint; it is a marathon! There are many perils and pitfalls that we will all inevitably encounter on the way. However, with God's grace given to us through His Sacraments, we will be able to endure all of the entrapments of the devil in order to cross the finish line victorious!

I pray that we will all someday be able to say what St. Paul famously said in his Second Letter to St. Timothy, "... The time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, [and] I have kept the faith." (2 Timothy 4:7) [4] I also pray that we will all someday hear the Lord say to us, "Well done, **good and** *faithful* servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master." (Matthew 25:23) [5]

Recall the Sacred Scripture passage, which reads: "Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is easy, that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard, that leads to life, and those who find it are few." (Matthew 7:13-14) [6]

One may ask, "How, then, are we to be victorious in God's sight in this life with so many pitfalls and perils?" For human beings on their own power, it is impossible! However, with God, all things are possible! <u>We are not alone in our race</u>, our journey in this life, my dear brothers and sisters in Christ! God is with us every step of the way!


