Pastor's Corner First Sunday of Advent 30 November 2025

Welcome to a brand new liturgical year! The Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic suggests that, “As we enter into [the Season of] Advent, we [should] watch for and eagerly await the dawn that breaks over the horizon!” For the dawn from on high shall break upon us! [1] **Can we say that we are awake? Can we say that we are prepared? Do not delay! We are ready! Maranatha – Come Lord Jesus, Come!**

Joyful anticipation – joyful watching – for a new day, a new reality, a new beginning will soon be within our midst – within our grasp – brightening all of the dark and cold places and realities that exist in this world with the warmth, the glow, the radiance of Christ’s everlasting and penetrating light! The bluish violet liturgical color of the Advent Season reminds us of the season of watchful preparation that Christians undertake for the upcoming commemoration of the Birth of Jesus Christ. Violet has traditionally been the primary color of Advent. This hue symbolizes repentance and fasting – some form of self-denial – showing one’s devotion to God and serving to prepare one’s heart for Christ’s Nativity. This is a way to help “purge” the junk that is in our hearts and minds so that we start anew, we start afresh, trying to be better disciples of Christ in a brand new liturgical year! This is a spiritual “mulligan (do-over),” of sorts!

Therefore, we are to, “Stay awake, for [we] do not know when the Lord will come. The four weeks of Advent are meant for us to prepare our hearts for three comings of Christ - His birth in Bethlehem (which we celebrate as Christmas). His return at the end of time [the Parousia – the Second coming], and His coming to us here and now. Our preparations include prayer, reception of the sacraments, good works, and sacrifices. Although everyone’s preparations will look different, they are all meant to cleanse us from sin and teach us to welcome Christ with love.” [2] **Can we say that we are awake? Can we say that we are prepared? Do not delay! We are ready! Maranatha – Come Lord Jesus, Come!**

The bluish purple of Advent (different from the reddish purple of Lent – signifying Christ’s blood shed for us) also reminds me of the journey undertaken by the three Magi from the East. The three wise men followed that very special star that appeared in the night sky, which led them to where the Christ Child was lying in a manger.

“The promise of Advent is the promise of a candle in a dark room – of the dawn breaking over the horizon. It is the promise that the darkness **cannot** – [**and will not**] – stand in the presence of the light. In this holy season, we must be watchers, searching for Christ’s light, eagerly awaiting the dawn. **Are we awake? Are we prepared?**” [3]

“Today’s collect reflects well the readings we just heard proclaimed. From [The Book of] Isaiah, we hear of the [multitude of] nations streaming toward Jerusalem. They come to realize that God, **the true God**, has [indeed] come within their reach! [Therefore,] they set out, maybe even run, to be in God’s presence. **In orienting themselves toward God, they lay aside their bickering and warfare and turn instead to fruitful works that truly benefit humanity.**” [4]

[St. Paul’s] message for us this Sunday is that the light of Christ is dawning, and we must not only awaken, but we need to act. This means putting behind us those things that we are too embarrassed to speak about [to others]. Instead, we need to put on the character of Jesus Christ! [5] Instead, we need to move toward the **Light!** The **Light** that is Christ Himself!

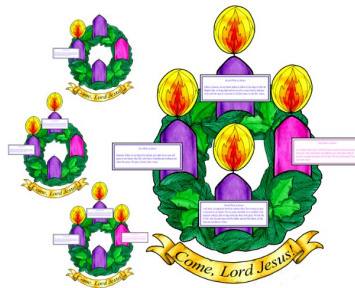
