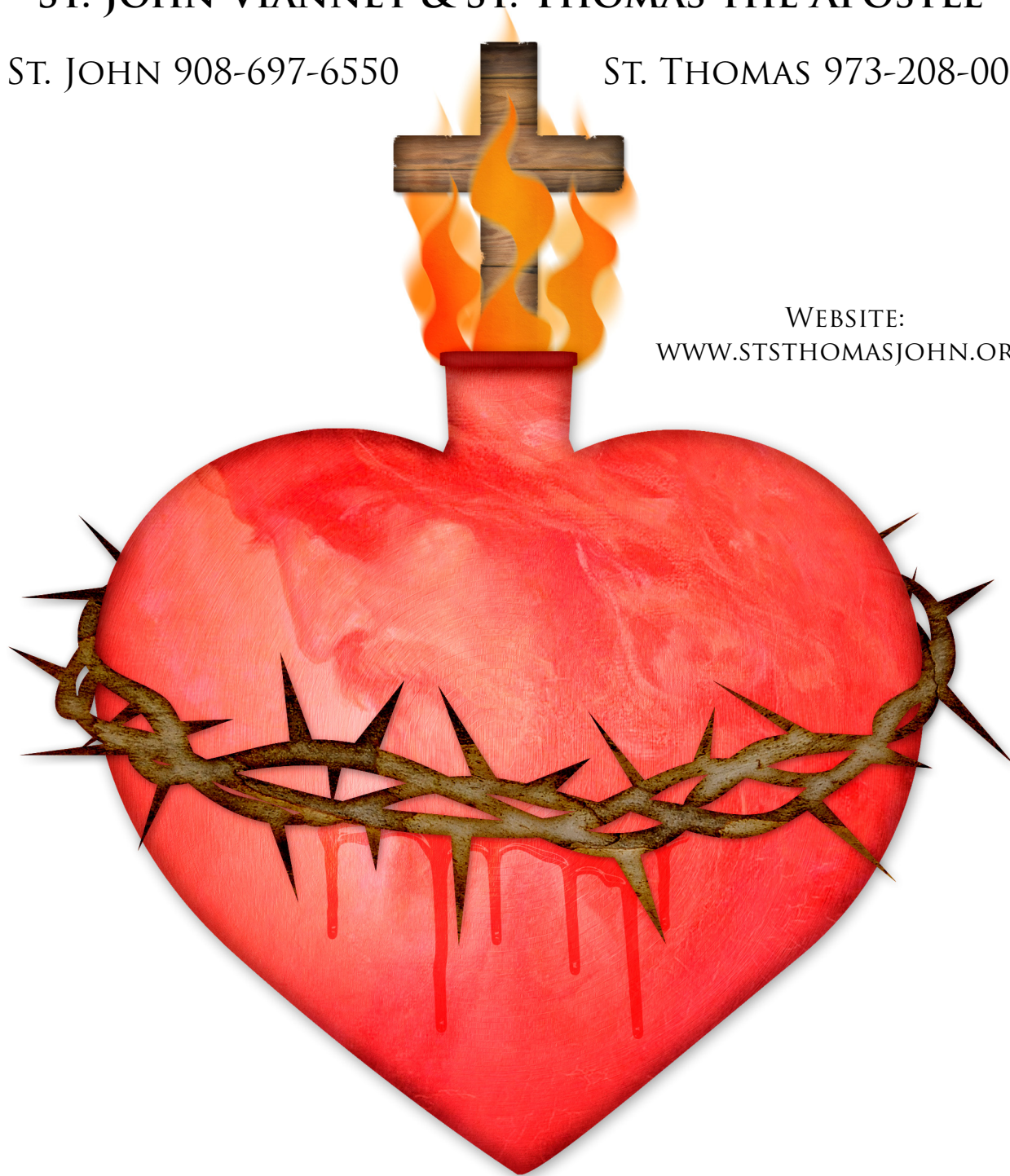

Pastor's Corner Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 14 June 2026

"Let us respond to God's love with generous hearts." [1] According to the Daily Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, "The theme of God's unending love for us, His people, runs through our [Sacred Scripture] readings today. Saint Paul points out that **Christ** died for us *while we were still sinners*, and Jesus' **heart** was ***moved with pity*** when He saw the troubled crowd. Let us strive to imitate this great love by obeying Jesus' instruction in the Gospel: 'Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.'" [2]

If we follow Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd, ***He*** will lead us to green pastures and the refreshment of our souls. If we listen to God's voice, and keep His covenant, we will become God's special possession! God will summon us and use us to lead others to Him! We are the sheep of the Lord's flock!

There are many in the world who "cannot see the forest for the trees." Many are so focused on the tasks of daily life, that they lose sight of the "big picture...***the forest*** for the trees." According to the Loose-Leaf Lectionary for Mass, "We, too abide in this forest. We who can easily be distracted by all the trees, all the little things that keep us from fulfilling our common vocation. [We] are called out at baptism to continue the work that the Twelve [Apostles] began." [3]

"God's heart has been moved with pity for us throughout salvation history. God sees us in our wanderings, like sheep without a shepherd. Our readings today weave together a tender saga of God's loving care as He works to gather us [and others] back unto Himself." [4] God accomplishes this important ministry through His disciples who are sent out into the world!

This is another example, mentioned in the Sacred Scriptures, of Jesus summoning His disciples and sending them forth into the world to evangelize. It bears repeating that the baptized have been anointed: priest, prophet and king! The priestly dignity of Christ, the prophetic dignity of Christ and the royal dignity of Christ have been bestowed upon the baptized through the power of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Baptism. ***These gifts of the Holy Spirit help prepare Jesus's disciples for future service in ministry within the Church. We are not talking about ordained ministry here.*** We are talking about the witness, the ministry, of **the baptized who are disciples** of Christ.

"In the first reading [from the Book of Exodus], God reminds the Israelites of His care, exhorts them to keep His covenant, and promises to make them a ***kingdom of priests, a holy nation***. In [St.] Paul's Letter to the Romans, we are reminded that we were reconciled, [while we were still sinners], through [Jesus] Christ. In the Gospel [passage from St. Matthew], Jesus is moved with pity and sends His disciples to heal and preach." [5] In fact, "When we were still helpless, at the appointed time, Christ died for the godless... **So it is proof of God's own** love for us that Christ died for us while we were still sinners." Romans (5:6-7) [6]

If we follow **Jesus Christ, the Good Shepherd**, ***He*** will lead us to green pastures and the refreshment of our souls. If we listen to God's voice, and keep His covenant, we will become God's special possession! God will summon us and use us to lead others to Him! **We are the sheep of the Lord's flock!** Be well and God bless you and those whom you love.

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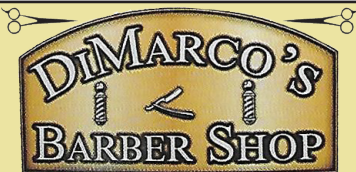


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
