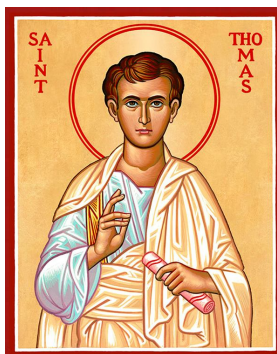
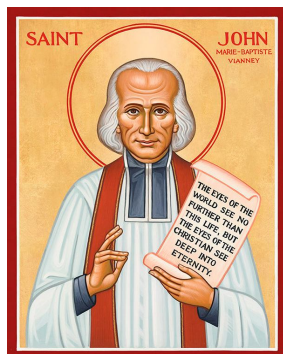

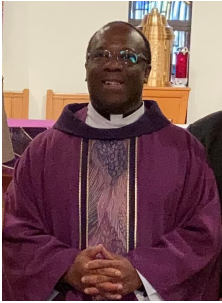

Pastor's Corner Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 20 February 2022

“You had heard that it was said, ‘You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.’ But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your

Father who is in heaven” (Matthew 5:43-44). [1]

The above teaching by Jesus Christ is a perfect example of why He is called “counter-cultural,” and the fact that His disciples are called to be just as “counter-cultural!” This world calls upon us to seek revenge for being wronged, and to “get even” with those who hurt or harm us in any way. God, Who is the very manifestation of love itself, calls upon His disciples, His followers, to emulate – to witness to – that very same agape love! This is most definitely one of the toughest things that Christians are commanded to do by the Lord. It is easy to seek revenge. It is very worldly to do so. However, to seek to forgive someone who has really hurt us is truly saintly, and not of this world at all!

In the Gospel of St. Matthew, we read, “You have heard that it was said, ‘An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.’ But I say to you, Do not resist one who is evil. But if any one strikes you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also” (Matthew 5:38-39). [2] Now, to be perfectly clear, there are indeed times in which one has to stand up for oneself and one’s family, especially when our family members are being threatened with violence or some form of harm. However, under normal circumstances, that are not life-threatening, we should seek peaceful resolutions and reconciliation – in a word, love – instead of using confrontation and a belligerent attitude as a means to a solution for a dispute or problem. This is very counter-cultural, shocking and controversial indeed! Christ’s teachings fly directly in the face of the attitudes taught by this world!

Recall that in 2016 we celebrated the Year of Mercy in the Catholic Church. As Christians, we are supposed to witness to God’s love in this world, and to bear the image of His mercy as well. In today’s Gospel passage from St. Luke, we learn that David showed an abundance of mercy to King Saul who sought an opportunity to kill David. Then, in an unforeseen turn of events, the Lord delivered King Saul into David’s grasp while they were both in a cave. David could have easily killed King Saul, but he refused to do so! Thus, David showed mercy to an enemy who was trying his best to kill him! King Saul then realized the error of his ways, and was allowed an opportunity for a complete change of heart!

Does the above scenario sound far-fetched? How many times have we appeared before God, both sinful and sorrowful, asking Him to have mercy on us for the forgiveness of our sins? I do not believe that I am incorrect in saying that the vast majority of us have been to Confession multiple times seeking God’s mercy and forgiveness! I will close this homily with another Sacred Scripture passage. In the Gospel of St. Matthew, we read, “So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart” (Matthew 18:35). [3] This is the end of the Gospel passage that spoke about the wicked servant who was shown great mercy by his master who forgave him a huge debt (practically impossible to repay) who, in turn, showed no mercy at all to a fellow servant who owed him only a fraction of what he himself had owed his merciful master. There is a stern warning at the end of this Gospel passage! I personally try to heed the teachings contained in this passage lest I myself receive a dose of my own medicine in front of the pearly gates! That would be most unfortunate indeed! Be well and God bless.

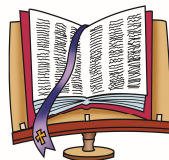
PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY
