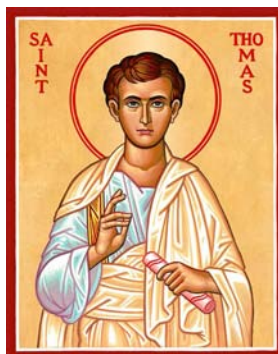
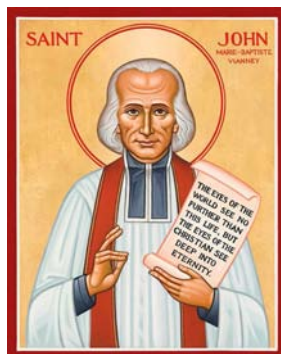

Pastor's Corner Fifth Sunday of Easter 15 May 2022

Plain and simple! Most of Jesus Christ's teachings center upon one theme – one word – **Love** – (**Agape** love specifically). As we know, **charity** is another word for **love**. Therefore, Christian charity is Christian love – Love of God, Love of self, and Love of neighbor! Plain and simple! **The Decalogue** – **The Ten Commandments** were whittled down to the two **Great Commandments**: “You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.” (1 John 4:7) [1] Then, on Ascension Day, Jesus whittled the two

Great Commandments down to the **New Commandment**: “A **New Commandment** I give to you, that you love one another; even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.” (John 13:34-35) [2]

Love – Agape Love – self-giving, self-sacrificing love! God is love! How many times have we heard this statement? **Never** have we heard that God is not love. **Never** have we heard that God is the seven deadly sins! All sin comes from a lack of love. A lack of love of God, yourself, or your neighbor

Why is it that so many books, songs, television programs and movies focus in on love as a main theme? Could it be that true love is very hard to find, and then, once found, to hold on to? We must focus on true love – agape love – not eros (lust). Lust is selfish and self-serving, not caring about the well-being of the other person involved. Eros focuses solely upon gratification – the gratification of one's own desires without caring at all about the well-being of the other – even oftentimes being hurtful to the other person. That is not true love. That is not love at all. Rather, it is lust.

Agape is the love that Jesus teaches. **Agape** is the love that **God Is!** This is the type of love that all of Christ's disciples **are called** to emulate! How can we say that we **love** God, whom we *cannot* see with bodily eyes [in the Flesh], when we hate our brother and our sister whom we *can* see with bodily eyes? *That is being phony, false, hypocritical!*

According to the Universal Prayer and Commentary by FAITH Catholic, “**Jesus wants us to love as He loves.** Our faithfulness and attentiveness to right and wrong, to holiness, and to the practice of our faith is important. **Yet Jesus furthers our understanding of following Him by making [crystal] clear the greatest commandment of every disciple: to love as He loves!**” [3]

Plain and simple. Most of Jesus Christ's teachings center upon one theme – one word – **Love** – (**Agape** love specifically). As we know, **charity** is another word for **love**. Therefore, Christian charity is Christian love – Love of God, Love of self, and Love of neighbor! Plain and simple! Therefore, what excuse do we have when we do not love as God loves? What excuse do we have when we fail to follow the New Commandment that Jesus Christ Himself taught and emulated by His examples while He was amongst us in the Flesh? None! No excuse! We cannot say that we have not been taught this over and over again! If we do say that we have not been taught this, that would be a world-class “whopper” of a falsehood! Be well and God bless you all in the love of God!

After a long discussion and period of reflection, the Latin-rite Diocesan Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Newark *have agreed to permanently transfer the observance of the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus to the Seventh Sunday of Easter, effective this Easter Season, 2022.* This Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus will be celebrated in all the Latin-rite dioceses

of New Jersey on *Sunday, May 29, 2022*, replacing the liturgical celebration and readings of the Seventh Sunday of Easter.

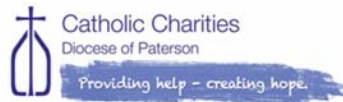

Jesus told us ‘that by their fruits you will know them.’ In the early days of the church non-Christians observed believers and remarked ‘see the Christians how they love one another.’ This is not a surprise, as we have been taught and commanded by Jesus.

How sad that so many spend their time criticizing the church, the weakness and human deficiencies, not realizing that we are the body of Christ. How sad, that others who profess to be Christians, spend so much time criticizing the Catholic church, rather than live the commandment which Jesus gave to all - love one another.

There is a great distinction between division and diversity. Did Jesus not pray, ‘that all may be one.’ Consider one person you can address and speak to them of unity not division. The old adage, ‘if you cannot say something well of a person, say nothing.’
