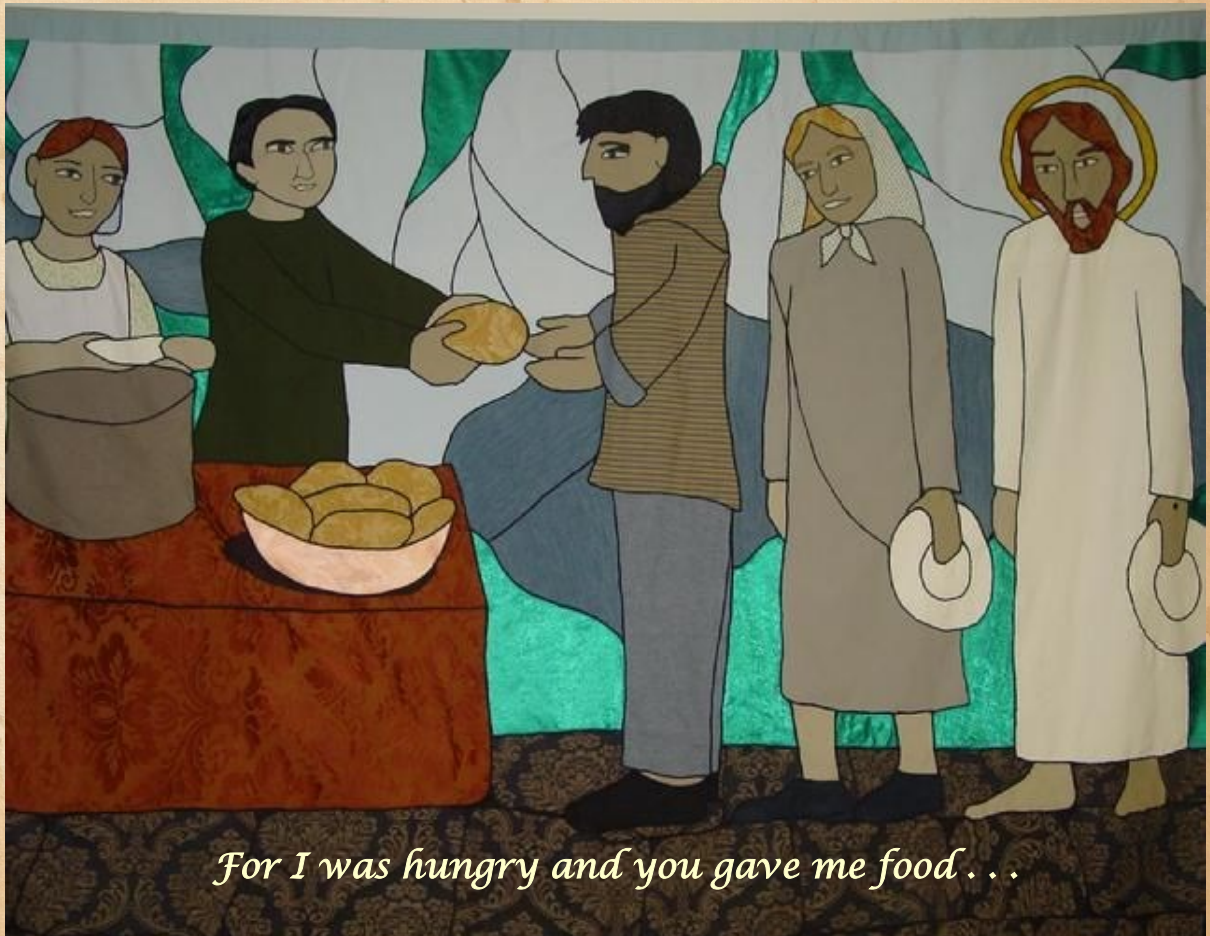

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, and our Gospel presents us with the only description of the Last Judgment in any of the four Gospels.

The judgment scene is Jesus' last discourse recorded by Matthew before the events of His passion unfold. In the vision he presents today, Jesus is the king who sits in judgment *"as a shepherd separates sheep from goats."* Mercy and charity will be the standards for determining a person's entry into the future kingdom of God.

As you listened to the Gospel being read, did you notice that Jesus makes no mention of the sins we usually worry about as the basis for the Last Judgment? This doesn't mean that those things don't matter. But the emphasis here has to do with getting out there and responding to people who are really in need. Why? It's because Jesus has clearly and unequivocally identified himself with the poor. Our greatness, *if you will*, lies in our ability to reach beyond ourselves to bring justice, peace and reconciliation into the lives of everyone, especially those who hunger and thirst, who are strangers, who lack clothing or a place to lay their head, need health care and who are imprisoned.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta summarized today's Gospel theme well when she said: *"At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by I was hungry and you gave me to eat . . . I was naked and you clothed me . . . I was homeless and you took me in. Hungry not only for bread -- but hungry for love; naked not only of clothing -- but naked of human dignity and respect; homeless not only for want of a room of bricks, but homeless because of rejection. This is Christ in distressing disguise."*

Each and every one of us needs to choose areas of Jesus' teaching where we can be counted among the sheep. To say that we are Christians demands a clear, conscious decision by us to participate in His vision. His is a vision far from a quaint little story from the past, but a mandate for today. When we do these things for any others, ultimately we do them for Him.

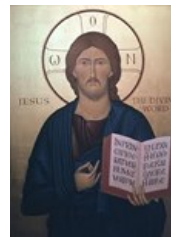

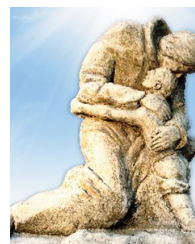

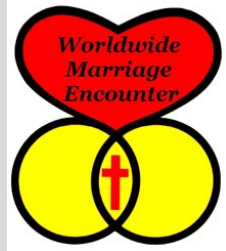
