A Kean Perspective

"Happy New Year!"

Just as last week the theme of Mary in the Fourth week of Advent led to the celebration of Christmas, so quite similarly the theme of the Holy Family leads us to the celebration of Mary and the New Year. It also keeps us very busy in our church schedule!

The great theme of the Sunday after Christmas is the Holy Family. Because January 1st is on Monday, the theme of the Holy Family and the Solemnity of Mary are closely connected. The role of the family takes on an even greater importance in the light of Mary's role as the Mother of God and mother within the Holy Family. The celebration of St. Mary on January 1st has the natural significance of Mary as the one who becomes the model for us in our hope for positive things in our New Year. The question becomes, then, how do we grow and imitate this incredible woman who was the mother of our Savior. One area that we can look to is the family and see the family as a place for us to foster virtues. In a way, the structure of the family can become a foundation on which we can allow our virtues to arow.

If we want to imitate the perfections of the Blessed Virgin Mary, then we will need a plan. In the culture around us there is much preoccupation with the idea of making resolutions. We do this because it is our plan to be better in the year before us than we were in the year behind us. The family can be an essential element of

that plan to improve. The family can be the arena in which our virtues are put to the test the most.

Mother Theresa would occasionally say that it is easy to love the poor children who live on the other side of the world, but that it is much harder to love the ones living in our own homes. Sometimes we can think that it was always easy for Mary to keep her cool while maintaining the daily elements of the Holy house in Nazareth. That's where I like to point out the scene of the "finding in the Temple" in Luke's gospel. How Mary and Joseph didn't lose it and become emotional messes after being separated from the lost boy Jesus for three days can be summed up in one word: virtues. Their virtues then were shown to be of the highest quality in the midst of a family mishap. When we have mishaps, how do we respond?

The family is a powerful determiner of who we are and how we handle difficulties. The family is a blessing. It should be a vessel of love and support that allows the virtues to flourish in our children. It is the instrument, as well, for the parents to polish and perfect the areas of patience and kindness. Does it always work out that way? Of course not, but we strive to improve every year. So let our resolutions be mindful of how we are in the family to one another just as much as we focus on health, diet, and exercise for our individual well-being. And when we think of us trying to be kind to one another, let us also remember Mary, Jesus, and Joseph and their family in Nazareth.


