

Series 4, The Divine Conductor – Promptings



God's Symphony had Mary and Joseph in lead roles, but we all have essential parts that support the other musicians and the complete piece. An Albany woman shared a story that illustrates this perfectly.

About ten years ago, "Maria" began noticing random people coming to mind. Not necessarily family or friends; it was often acquaintances or fellow parishioners. She would say a prayer for the person, and the thought would vanish.

As time passed and promptings continued, in addition to saying a prayer, Maria would drop the person a note. That evolved into

giving them a call or stopping by to visit. I asked if she always found the people in need. She confirmed that every person was troubled in some way and she felt that the Holy Spirit was prompting her to help them.

Maria went on to tell me a story that happened on that very day. After waking, she thought of a fellow parishioner. Maria had just made soup and decided to take her some. It worked perfectly into her schedule: she would be dropping her grandson off at practice near the woman's home. When she arrived, she discovered the woman had fallen. She might have laid there a long time had it not been for Maria responding to the divine invitation.

It is clear that Jesus has been mentoring Maria for many years, giving her greater responsibilities as she proved ready. Had she not responded in the beginning by praying for Jesus' intentions, she would not have grown in confidence and trust and been ready to help in more complex ways.

I love the image of Jesus conducting that scene: Woman falls; He calls Maria. Jesus knows she will respond: it works in her schedule, and she just made soup! Or did He arrange for the timing of the grandson's practice and prompt her to make soup too? In either case, we see God is in control intricately conducting our daily lives, showing us the perfect way to direct our prayers and actions.

**Scripture:** Read 1 Peter 1:21. What is God saying to you?

**Call to Action:** Listen for Jesus' quiet promptings and make the choice to respond.

## while we're at it

**our vision** Create a parish of missionary disciples whose personal relationship with Jesus Christ inspires others into a life-changing relationship with Him.

Dear Friends,

Churches can stagnate just like any institution. Way too many do.

We decided to tackle this problem years ago when we started working on our vision and strategic plan for our parishes.

We developed a vision and plan to be parishes that produce disciples of Jesus, rather than just have members who “show up.” We enable people to follow Christ in their daily life and really live according to his teachings. That’s living in a counter-cultural way.

We also want to be a church that mostly pays attention to those outside the church – those who have never fully committed to be Christians and those who have drifted away. We want them back.

Our Senior Leadership Team is always reviewing where we are at with progress... are we getting stronger, better, more focused on priorities? Are we leading people closer to Christ so he can transform them into disciples, are we challenging people with the full message of the Gospel? Or are we growing complacent, doing the same things over again?

On many levels we seem pretty healthy: good worship, perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, increasing numbers coming to confession, a clear discipleship path for those seeking to go deeper, outreach programs, religious education geared to the whole family, the best in adult faith formation, a good sense of stewardship with increasing revenues, healthy pride in our parish...

But one thing God has put on my heart in recent months is our need to do more to serve the poor and homeless. That’s a part of the Gospel we can’t ignore. To that end, we’ve developed a relationship with a sister parish in a poor section of the Bronx – St. Anthony of Padua. We started up a homeless shelter for Brewster. We founded a non-profit called Brewster Cares to serve the homeless, to tutor kids challenged in their learning environment, to develop successful parenting skills in immigrant parents. We’ve run two successful **Giving Help and Hope** food and essential items campaigns...



I have a sense that not only are those things all worthwhile because Jesus commanded it, but they are also a new way to reach out to those away from the Church, who have little relationship with God right now. Often volunteers step up to help who aren’t parishioners... These programs provide a “meeting place” where we can work with those of good will, even if they aren’t attending our church.

Maybe the Holy Spirit is trying to tell us something. Give it some thought yourself and let me know how you see things. I’d be happy to hear your take on it all – where we are at as a parish, and where we should be going.

## surviving the holidays

My father passed away on Christmas Day 2019. That morning I left the hospital knowing that Christmas would never be the same for my family and me. When I returned home, I mustered up the will to put on a brave face for my sons and extended family. I immediately began cooking and baking as we always hosted Christmas Day. Many of the events of that day are a blur, however, I remember the peace and calm I felt in the kitchen and essentially “made it through.” Throughout 2020, my faith, baking and prayer helped me heal.

As this year’s holiday season approached, I chose to focus on the nuances of Thanksgiving and Christmas gatherings amidst a global pandemic. In my mind, I had made peace with the death of my father and was going to celebrate Christmas as usual. Then, Lynda contacted me about attending Surviving the Holidays Bereavement. Two thoughts came to mind while she spoke to me. The first, clearly reactionary, was that I did not need a program like this. The second, more reflective, was that I had always been grateful for the many parish programs and support extended to me before my father’s passing. So, filled with that Catholic guilt, I felt obligated to attend.

The days leading up to the workshop were rough for me. Having it on the calendar, forced me to think about the holidays in rela-

tion to grieving. It was difficult because I did not consider myself to still be grieving and thinking bereavement was in the rear-view mirror. I did not believe I would get much out of the program. I was wrong!

Within minutes of entering the conference room in the Parish Center, I recognized the benefits of gathering with others to process loss as well as receive and give compassion. I found comfort sitting in a room with others that had the shared experience of loss. Although everyone was in different stages of grief, there was a familiarity in the potpourri of emotions. There were many strategies discussed on how to cope with the holidays. My greatest takeaway was to plan ahead. I forced myself to think about how I was going to handle feelings of sadness and family questions/comments. COVID-19 gathering restrictions worked in my favor as I was able to be with just my nuclear family. I also spent a good portion of the day in “kitchen therapy” baking a variety of desserts. It was a win-win for all. I gave myself the grace to grieve as well as experience joy without guilt. I truly believe that attending the program positively impacted how I was able to experience the one-year anniversary of my father’s death.

**From Mourning to Joy Bereavement Group** begins on Feb 2. I highly recommend that if you are suffering from a loss that you consider joining. It may help you manage the myriad of emotions related to loss as it did for me.

## brewster cares emergency shelter

Brewster Cares is now almost 2 months into the operation of the homeless shelter. To date, 13 unique individuals have accessed the shelter, and we anticipate that the bitter cold winter weather (that we have yet to see) may bring even more people to our doors. Creating and staffing an organization that could meet the urgent need of shelter for our brothers and sisters,

has been a big undertaking, but God has a way of leading us and providing for us in our need. On our part, the recipe was prayer, trust in God and a willingness to roll up our sleeves and do whatever He called us to do.

An organizational structure was established: a board of directors was assembled, an operations manager and overnight and warming center supervisors were hired, and lastly a site was secured and renovated to allow for the opening of a daytime warming center. The warming center also serves as a meeting location for our homeless guests to speak with professional counselors from the Department of Social Services. To date, Brewster Cares has been able to connect some guests with housing services, SNAP benefits (formerly food stamps) and most importantly to begin a dialogue that is the critical first step in connecting them with resources they need.

An outstanding crew of coordinators stepped up to ensure the smooth nightly operation of the shelter, with all that entails including (but not limited to) organizing the cooking and serving of meals, kitchen clean-up, ensuring supplies are adequate and on-the-job volunteer training. These amazing people give of themselves through their corporal works of mercy. I had the opportunity to speak with three women who are this year's coordinators: Cathy Quaranta, Jo-Ann Adorno and Deb Lawlor. They were genuinely enthusiastic and spoke of the importance of respect for all God's children, being a helping hand extension of Jesus. They would definitely 'do it again', and loved the cooperation and collaboration with other churches including the sharing of responsibilities with Christians outside our parish which unites us as children of God. Their comments were inspiring: "the guests are so appreciative and humble, the experience is humbling and lets you see the good in people, the operations manager stops by every day and encourages us, all the supervisors are great, it's smoother than I envisioned, when Father Gill first spoke about it something in my heart said I could...". Is everything perfect? No, but they are dedicated and work to address the challenges. It's all a part of life's journey toward eternal life.

I'd like to invite you to pick up the phone and offer your help as a host. You might feel intimidated, even frightened at the prospect of working at a homeless shelter, but I can tell you that once you take that first step, your feelings will change. Listen and let the Holy Spirit work through you. Take the first step and just say yes.


