## *The Angelus Prayer*



Do you hear the bells ringing in the morning, at noon, and in the evening? Before watches, the bells served as a call to stop what you were doing and pray the Angelus. This prayer offers an opportunity to meditate for a few moments midday on Mary's discipleship and radical obedience to God's will. The Angelus is yet another beautiful tradition of our Church. It is a simple yet powerful means of dramatically opening your heart up to receive God's grace.

**V/.** The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary,  
**R/.** And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.

**V/.** Behold the handmaid of the Lord,

**R/.** Be it done unto me according to your Word.

Hail Mary...

**V/.** And the Word was made flesh,

**R/.** And dwelt among us.

**Let us pray.** Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts: that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

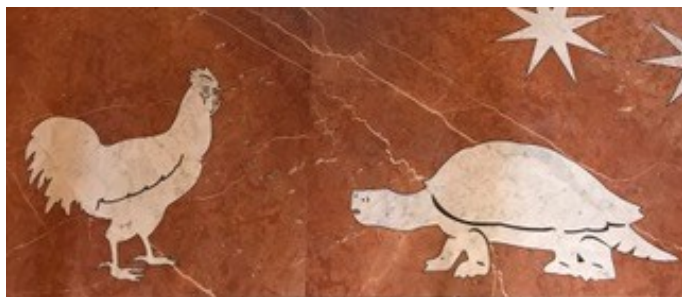
