It is a simple yet powerful means of dramatically opening your heart up to receive God's grace.

Religious Education Challenge Question!

The children in the Religious Education Program will be learning about the sanctuary and baptistry over the next few weeks. After their lesson, they should be able to answer the following: What is the difference between a "table" and an "altar"? What is the significance of the pomegranate in the St. Augustine baptistry?

Answer to last week's challenge questions:

What does the word sanctuary mean? Sanctuary means "a consecrated place, sacred place." The sanctuary is the space in the church with the altar, tabernacle, the ambo and presider's chair.

What is the significance of the rooster and the tortoise in the parish baptistry? The rooster symbolizes Christ, who calls the tortoise (the people) out of the darkness of its shell.




